**Dress Code Reminder** The RCHS dress code states that “all clothing worn to school and school functions should be modest, neat, clean and

appropriate.” Therefore, the currently popular style of wearing ripped, torn, shredded and full-of-holes jeans and shorts should not be worn to school. Students wearing this style of clothing will be asked to change and parents may need to be called to bring in a change of clothes.
