When I was a boy growing up in the San Francisco Bay Area, we were so excited when the Monterey Bay Aquarium first opened. It had kelp forests and all the fish and sea otters from the bay for everyone to see. You could even pet sting rays!

I don't know why I was so interested in ocean creatures, but I do remember seeing a Jacques Cousteau film at a young age that sparked my curiosity. It's fascinating to think that humans know more about outer space than the depths of our own planet's oceans.

Rehoboth alum, Gabe Gonzaga, spends his days living out my childhood fantasies aboard the OceanXplorer, one of the world's most advanced sea research vessels. His job there is to capture on film the important work of research and ocean stewardship that OceanX takes on. "Our mission is to equip the world to pay more attention to the ocean and how we steward it," he says. That mission has seen Gabe travel most recently throughout Southeast Asia—working in the waters of Malaysia, Indonesia, and Singapore. At every turn, their research enhances our knowledge of undersea habitats and equips countries, NGO's, and the world at large to better care for these places in the future. That work is right in line with Rehoboth's throughline, Creation Keepers, which is why it's so exciting to see Gabe bearing that fruit in his professional life.

Recognizing his value as a child of God and knowing the importance of his faith, Gabe wants to make sure that he approaches his work from a Christian perspective. "In this field, not everyone knows the love and grace of God. I can be the salt of the earth for them." His mindset is a gift to everyone in his orbit, and it's at the heart of what we work so hard to instill in our students.

Seeing nourished roots bear future fruit is the fulfillment of our mission, and it's something that wouldn't be possible without your interest, prayers, and support. Thank you, as always, for keeping us close to your hearts and making our community such a special place.
