Specific Needs

High Desert Horizons – Sixth grade is a time of transition and change as students shift from elementary to middle school. At Rehoboth Christian School, we offer a 6th grade program named High Desert Horizons (HDH) where the

classroom expands into the local community and surrounding area. Using the Place Based Education model, the students are immersed into local heritage and culture, landscapes and ecosystems, opportunities and experiences. Whether it be on a mesa in the high desert, at a national monument or park, or within the city of Gallup, students will connect their learning with their natural and social community. Our students will expand their horizons and get to know our Creator more deeply through being in His world, and being a light to those around them (Matthew 5:14).

Tuition Assistance Need

We are grateful for your support as we seek to help families with tuition assistance this year. Our annual tuition assistance need for the 2024-2025 school year is \$1,910,000. We are thankful for a good start to the school year with \$391,689 received for tuition assistance through September 19.

SALT Program

This school year we are working hard to maintain the great programming and supports that we have been able to implement over the past year. We are currently able to offer speech, occupational, and physical therapies, as well as life skills experiences through community work study placements. We praise God for the way he has provided for the SALT program, and how he has been working in the lives of our SALT students and families. Due to some changes in the funding received through the local district and state of New Mexico, the total remaining need to fund the SALT program for the 24-25 school year is \$265,022.
