Table Talk

I teach one of our middle school advisory classes every morning here at Rehoboth. My 7th and 8th grade boys are great, and I'm really enjoying getting to know them. Today, we started with the first lesson of our *Habitudes* curriculum, which is a way to proactively instill the social and emotional skills our students need to flourish as people and leaders.

Today's lesson was called "Elephants and Splashes." It dealt with the necessity of being able to recognize who we really are and what we may be feeling at any given moment—to be self aware. With that knowledge, we can better understand why we act certain ways and how we can take charge of our emotions and behaviors to use them for the good of ourselves and others.

It's good stuff-even for middle school boys who aren't the most comfortable with talking about their emotions.

But what I found really interesting today was the lesson's "hook," the reason it was called "Elephants and Splashes."

Years ago, in some remote villages in Thailand, people noticed that several young elephants had gotten left behind from their herd. The villagers and some scientists kept tabs on those elephants and caught up with them when they were adults with children of their own. They seemed to be like all the other elephant herds, with one unique difference.

These elephants who had grown up on their own would drink differently than "regular" elephants. When they came to a stream or a pond to drink from, they would splash the water with their feet and their trunks to stir it up. It wasn't a different kind of water than regular elephants would drink, and it wasn't some kind of purification ritual to filter out anything harmful for the water.

What the locals and the researchers finally realized was that these stray elephants had developed the habit shortly after being separated from their parents and their native herd. Without the nurturing of their mothers and fathers, these elephant calves did not want to bend down to the still water to drink . . . because that would mean looking at their own reflection.

It's a fascinating bit of research that reminds us of something true about humans too. We need love and nurturing from our mentors and family members in order to become comfortable with who we are and who God created us to be. Let's make sure that Rehoboth remains a strong partnership between home and school—one that makes sure our children never have to be afraid of who they might see in the mirror.

Afternoon Pick-up Routines

All K-8 student pick-up is designated at the Gravel Loop located behind the Elementary and Middle School. All students should be picked up here unless prior arrangements for bus transportation and/or Middle School sports practices have been made. While the loop can get busy, having one spot ensures that your students are safe and have adequate supervision.


The Gravel Loop is meant to be a single lane. Cars that need to park should pull forward as much as possible (close to the church) so other cars can maneuver and keep the line going behind (see diagram below). When it is your turn, please pull forward and wait for your student. There should not be two lanes. For the safety of your students, we do not want them to be moving in between cars. Upon exiting, please use turn signals, slowly pull out of the lane, and be mindful of other cars that may be exiting at the same time.

If you prefer to park in the SFC lot, please walk to the gravel loop to pick up your student. Only those who have a student in Pre-K may park by the Elementary School playground as those families have to physically sign out their child. If you have students in *both* schools, you may park there BUT you still need to pick up your other students at the gravel loop.

Pick-up time is 3:05 to 3:25. You will find students at the Gravel Loop.

- After 3:25, students are walked back inside to wait in the office where phone calls will be made.
- After 3:45, any students still waiting in the office will join the After School Program with Sarah Marlowe. After the second occurrence, the daily fee of \$15 per student will be applied.

Half Way Through the First Quarter

This is the fifth week of school. For some it feels like school has been going for much more than five weeks, for others it feels like school has barely begun. Whatever the case, taking a moment to ask your student to reflect on the past five weeks is important. Ask what they have learned or what they have struggled with or what they have enjoyed in their classes. Hopefully there will be much to talk about. Please also assure them that there is time to change things (work habits, grades, effort) in the remaining four weeks before the quarter ends.

Advanced Placement classes, exams, and fees

If your student is in 11th or 12th grade, they may be in an Advanced Placement (AP) class this year. Rehoboth offers AP Calculus, AP English, AP Precalculus, and AP US HIstory. These classes are wonderful opportunities full of academic rigor. The classes work toward an exam that is given by the College Board in May. Early in the year AP students are asked to register for those AP exams; the deadline for ordering those exams is November 15, so if you or your student wishes to change their registration status please let Mr. Weidenaar or the AP teacher before November 15. The AP

exams are given by Rehoboth but are made by the College Board, so they come with an additional fee. That fee is \$99 or \$62. The lower price is based upon your free and reduced lunch status, so filling out that form and turning it in at the administration office is very important. (You can find it on pages 14-15 of this Parent News). The fees will be collected in the Spring.

Picture Day and Senior Pictures

Picture day is scheduled for October 1 and 2. Mark your calendars. These pictures will be used for student identification and yearbook photos. Even if you do not plan to order pictures, they are still important.

If your student is a senior, our yearbook advisor, Mr. Perkins, (or a member of the yearbook staff) will be requesting a suitable senior picture. Please provide that photo in a timely manner, and feel free to reach out to Mr. Perkins with any questions you may have regarding that photo.

Parent pick-up and drop-off

If you are dropping off or picking up students from the high school, please park in the main parking lot of the high school/sports and fitness center. Convenient spots for pick up are the parking spots on the east side of the lot. In the afternoon buses will be parked and loaded on the curb. Please ask your student to walk behind the buses to enter the parking lot.

Counseling Services

Rehoboth is in a great position to offer counseling services to high school students. Mr. Ensign is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC), and he strives to give students tools and ideas to help them better navigate their lives. He patiently listens and asks necessary questions to help students glimpse and grasp a flourishing life. If your student is in need of counseling students please contact Mr. Ensign (he prefers that you email him at densign@rcsnm.org), or you can contact Mr. Weidenaar and he will speak to Mr. Ensign.

Grade reports

Grade reports are sent out on Monday afternoons. Please take a moment to look through the grade report, and please ask your student a few questions about that report. Ask what classes they enjoy, or what they are struggling with, or what is happening in specific classes. If your student is struggling in a class or failing a class do assure them that they can pass and that they can ask their teachers what will help them raise their grades. If your student is failing a class on the grade report they will not be able to travel or play games with their teams. However, those grades can and will be changed if students work to change them.






