<u>Spring ODY Scholarship</u>: Applications are available at the high school and at the administration building. Please return your completed application to either <u>Mrs. Lynch</u> at the high school or at the administration building. This is open to **high school students** who are enrolled with the Navajo Nation and have a GPA of 3.3 or higher.

Students are considered first time if they were not awarded for the Fall 2023 but are applying for the Spring. First time applicants will need to submit an essay and two teacher recommendations along with the application. The admissions office will be bringing the completed applications to Window Rock on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 9</u>. Please turn them in before then as our business office needs to do the financial paperwork for the application.

Re enrollment: For all current families, re enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year will begin on **January 16th at 5pm**. Here are some details to know:

- 1. One parent will receive an email that the re enrollment packet is open in their Family Portal.
- 2. Only one parent is considered the "responsible parent" for re-enrollment.
- 3. The email will contain a link to the Family Portal
- 4. The "responsible parent" needs to have a username and password set up with their Family Portal. To get yourself set up for a Parent Portal, <u>click here.</u> If you need to reset your password follow the prompts.

Lastly, the class with the highest percentage of re enrollment by January 31st will receive a class prize.

<u>Tuition payments:</u> A reminder that every month, a tuition payment needs to be paid. You can make your payments by phone through credit (505-863-4412), at our administration building, mail in payment, or use our free service of <u>FACTS</u>. Every credit card payment has a fee.

Other Scholarships:

ACE Scholarship will be open on February 8th and end on April 15th.


