April 8 Solar Eclipse

On April 8, there will be a solar eclipse which will begin at 11:15 am, reach its peak with 66% of the sun being covered at 12:28pm and end by 1:40 pm. This special celestial event is treated differently by various brothers and sisters of our school community. We will respect the decisions of families regarding the eclipse. Families may choose to keep their children home or may request that students not go outside or eat during the eclipse if that is part of your tradition. Other students may be allowed to safely observe the eclipse under the supervision of their teachers. This is a great example of Rehoboth's commitment to being a big tent and respecting and loving each other even though we have a variety of understandings of how to live out our love for God.




New Student applications for the 2024-2025 year:

The new student applications are now available. If you are a current parent interested in adding an additional child, you can fill out an application within your Family Portal account. When completed we will be connecting with you on the next steps. If you know anyone interested in applying, they can start an <u>application online here</u>.

<u>ACE Scholarship:</u> It is very important that you use these links below to login. You will first have to update your FACTS account then go to another link to fill out the ACE Scholarship application. Again, this is a free and if a payment portion comes up for you, you need to log out and use the steps below to connect it all.

Go here First: We are finding out that the incorrect website URL is being used for your FACTS signin- don't use the URL you used last year.

Instead, use the following link HERE_(https://online.factsmgt.com/grant-aid/inst/46T5C/landing-page) this will connect you with Rehoboth Christian School. If Rehoboth Christian School comes up you are using the correct website and you can select the year 2024-2025 and answer all the required questions - you can also download your 2023 tax documents here. Make sure you submit it. If Rehoboth Christian School does not come up, then you are not using the right URL for the website, go back and use the link. Here is a screen shot of what you should see when you go to the website.



Second: Once that is complete please go <u>HERE</u> to fill out the ACE scholarship application. Please use the same sign in as FACTS (from step 1).

If the ACE scholarship is still asking you to pay then you have not connected with Rehoboth Christian School. **YOU SHOULD NOT BE PAYING FOR THE ACE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**. Please start over with the first link.

Here are some other details to note when applying:

- 1. We will be taking care of the application fee
- 2. The application deadline is April 15th.
- 3. Arizona families can apply
- 4. Applications are one per family
- 5. Please fill out if you are financially eligible ASAP, see below.. Be sure to upload all the documents needed.
- 6. To complete, you need the following:
 - a. 2023 tax forms
 - b. Social security, disability, housing allowance, food stamps, child support documentation, and any documentation of additional sources of income that are not reported on your 1040.

Lynx Scholarship:

If there are circumstances that are making it difficult for you to pay your tuition, you can apply for the <u>LYNX</u> <u>SCHOLARSHIPS</u>.


