On Monday of this week, school was closed in observance of Navajo Sovereignty Day. Clarissa Johnson from our elementary school sent around a video to the staff there explaining the significance of sovereignty for the Navajo Nation, some of the unique benefits that come with sovereignty, as well as its challenges. If you're interested in checking it out, you can <u>watch the 15-minute video here</u>.

A few years ago, while we were playing in the Santa Rosa High School basketball tournament, we took the team to visit the Bosque Redondo Museum at Fort Sumner. What a solemn experience that was. After hearing the recorded descriptions of the conditions at Bosque Redondo and the traumatic memories of the Long Walk, we all had new respect for the resilience that somehow carried people through those horrors.

It makes it easy to understand why achieving tribal sovereignty was such a big deal.

That word, *sovereignty*, is an important one in our faith too. The definition is "supreme power and authority," and in the context of the branch of Christianity from which our school was founded, we use that word a lot in connection to God. His plan–His will . . . is going to be worked out in this world, no matter how much the powers of evil and the wrong choices of sinful people try to mess it up.

It's comforting to know that we can rely on God's sovereignty for the courage and resilience we need to make it through our own hardships today. And because of that same sovereignty, we can step into the midst of other people's suffering to give them a shoulder to lean on-tapping into the collective strength we share as God's people.

Sovereignty offers strength and an identity. On Navajo Sovereignty Day, we give thanks for and celebrate the strength and the identity of the Navajo people ... and I pray that those reflections will remind us of the sovereignty and ultimate plan of our Heavenly Father and Creator God. The prophet Isaiah talks about that plan saying, "Every valley shall be exalted And every mountain and hill brought low; The crooked places shall be made straight And the rough places smooth; The glory of the LORD shall be revealed, And all flesh shall see it together; For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

There are still inequities and injustices facing the Diné and other Indigenous peoples today, and I'm thankful that we serve a God who wants those crooked places made straight and who wants those rough places made smooth. He has the sovereignty to do it, and He asks for our partnership in those efforts as His people.

# New Students for the 25-26 school year:

Enrollment for new students is open. If you are a current family and plan to add a new student for the 25-26 school year you will be able to do that through your family portal in renweb. Our pre-k for next year is waitlist only. Please go to <a href="https://www.rcsnm.org">www.rcsnm.org</a> then to Pre-K admissions under the admissions tab to fill out the waitlist form. Once space becomes available we will inform you of the opening and then we can have you fill out the application.

#### Re enrollment:

For all current families, re-enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year began on January 17th. A parent should have received an email.

Here are some details to know:

1. One parent will receive an email that the re-enrollment packet is open in their Family Portal.

2. Only one parent is considered the "responsible parent" for re-enrollment and will get the packet for their child(ren).

3. The email will contain a link to the Family Portal.

4. The "responsible parent" needs to have a username and password set up with their Family Portal. To get yourself set up for a Parent Portal, <u>click here</u>. If you need to reset your password follow the prompts.

# Who is June Camp for?

June camp is for any student between the ages of entering Kindergarten up to entering 9th grade! We have June Camp focused for students K-5 and a June Camp High Desert Horizons for 6-9 grade.
