As Kindergarten starts its first day of school today, it's hard to believe the rest of the school is already one week in!

Welcome back everyone! Your students are a delight and bring so much joy to our community. This year we will use our school theme *Amazed!* to recognize and name the amazing things that God has done, is doing, and will do in our lives. I often see and experience God in solitude and in His beautiful creation, but I challenge myself, our students, staff and you to see and shout out the goodness of God that we see in people. In our elementary and middle school chapels last week we talked about how sometimes seeing God in people can be harder because of our sinful nature. When I challenged students to shout out ways they see God in people, hands shot up: We see God through joy, kindness, making new friends, inviting new students to a lunch table and to play tag at recess, hugs, and so much more. God is faithful, and that is evident through your students!

Drop-off and Pick-up

K-8 families should drop off and pick up all of their students in the gravel loop behind the elementary building and church. The elementary playground parking lot is reserved for families of Pre-K students who need to park and walk their students to the building.

As you drop off and pick up your students please pull right up to the car in front of you to keep the traffic flowing. After school, if a car leaves and you are still waiting for your student, please pull forward to fill the space so that the line moves forward. For the safety of our students, please do not form two lines; we do not want our students darting between cars and traffic.

High School Highlights

Welcome Back!

It has been a great start to the school year so far in the high school. In our opening chapel this week, I shared my Deep Hope with our students: "My Deep Hope is for everyone to find welcome, connection, and belonging as they teach and learn at Rehoboth Christian High School." These deepening levels of relationship will stick with our students for the rest of their lives, and it's important for us to pursue them on a daily basis. My Storyline gives a little insight into what that needs to look like from day to day: "All In." I told our students that the Lord wants everything from us–not just dipping our toes in the water of living for Him, but jumping all the way in, cannonball style! This is how we should pursue our faith, our academics, our relationships, and everything in between. We've got to go all in! But I also want to make sure that at Rehoboth, *all* are *in*. When my wife and I first visited the school five years ago, we asked students what they appreciated most about this place. The replies were comments like, "Everyone belongs here," and "It doesn't matter how old you are or what your interests are. You can find a place to plug in." We have found that to be true for our own children, and my prayer is that all of our students experience the same. Ask your high school student about chapel to see what they remember and what they took from it.

Broken Arrow Day on Friday

Every year, the high school student body heads up to Broken Arrow Bible Ranch in Vanderwagen, NM for a day of fun and bonding. Friday, August 18 is our day this year. Ty Platero, the Director of Broken Arrow, will challenge and encourage our students about their faith, and then we'll have a fun day of games, food, and fellowship. Buses will leave for Broken Arrow shortly after school begins, and we will have all the students back before the end of the day and in time to ride the buses home. For this day:

- Wear comfortable clothing that will be good for playing outside.
- Think about bringing a hat and sunscreen for protection.
- Students may bring a water bottle as well, but just be sure not to leave it at Broken Arrow.
- Come with a heart open to having fun and bonding with your classmates.

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Food Service Line

How wonderful to see all the smiling faces - old and new, come through the lunch line! The great news is ALL KIDS EAT FREE!!!! Breakfast and Lunch! Breakfast is available at 7:30 in the morning at the HS Concession stand and lunch is in the Fellowship Hall.

I would like to thank all the new students for getting finger scans for counting lunch meals. One scan is all that is needed for their time at RCS. When the students graduate or are no longer an RCS student, they are deleted. The scans provide a more accurate count for our monthly reimbursement reporting and make our lunch line go faster! It is similar tech to that of your smartphone, a very common form of scanning. If you are uneasy about your child scanning, let me know that you would like to OPT-OUT and I will delete any scan I have for your student.

Wasting food to the lunch ladies is a BIG deal. It is hard to see their hard work end up in the trash can or in the chicken/food waste bucket! Remind your children that they may turn down an item on their tray. As long as they have 3 items on their tray, one being a fruit or vegetable, they have a reimbursable meal. We encourage them to eat everything, but if they know that they are NOT going to eat it, have them decline or share it! In these days of skyrocketing food costs and food shortages, training our kids to eat what is on their plate/tray is of great importance!
