# **High School Highlights**

#### Wisdom from Trip Lee

In Tuesday's chapel, I spoke with the students about a man I met at a conference in Atlanta, GA in 2018. Trip Lee is an ordained pastor, a Christian Rapper, and an incredibly powerful speaker. That day, he shared thoughts from his book, *Rise* (which would make a great Christmas or birthday gift for your teen!). He says we should do away with our <u>7:00 A.M.</u> Logic, which means that we should quit hitting the snooze button on life and get busy living for the Lord today. God does not share society's low expectations for young people. He knows they can make a powerful difference in the world right now! The second point was that <u>we need to fall out of love with being cool</u>. So many of our choices are motivated by what others will think of us. Social media doesn't help us defeat these mindsets, as we obsess about the number of likes, re-tweets, or reactions we get; but Trip Lee encourages us to remember that we already have the love and approval of the most important person–the Lord Himself! We can trust the unfailing love of Jesus because his highlight reel is all over the Bible, so we can let go of the pursuit of cool. Finally, we were reminded to <u>Point Up</u>. Similar to our last chapel, we were reminded that our lives should point people to God by the credit we give him and the trustworthiness that we display. Following God's will for our lives can seem like an impossible task sometimes, but in the book of Deuteronomy we're told that we *can* do it when we hold God's Word close to our hearts. Talk with your sons and daughters about this week's chapel and see what stood out to them.


