Table Talk

"What day is it?"

"SEPARATION DAY!"

This was a question asked often by our camp director this summer, and the thunderous response by the players served as a reminder that every day is an opportunity to separate ourselves from the person we were yesterday and from the people who aren't willing to sacrifice and work hard for their dreams. This is, of course, true in life—not just in basketball.

The camp is full of little abbreviations, "secret phrases," and mantras. One of them is "TIPI." Those initials stand for the phrase, "Temporary Inconvenience. Permanent Improvement."

Nothing worth having in this world comes easy. It all requires us to step out of our comfort zones into places where we aren't sure we'll be able to succeed–in fact, places where we will likely fail. But that discomfort won't last. It will soon give way to permanent improvement if we're able to stick with it. Our goal should not be to avoid failure at all costs. Instead, we should focus on <u>telling ourselves the right story</u> when failure happens.

Lean into difficulty. It's only a bad thing if you tell yourself the story that it's a bad thing.

Struggle is only a bad thing if you characterize it that way. Failure is only a bad thing if you catastrophize.

There's a story where

difficulty is a thing you enjoy,

struggle is just a part of the process of winning,

and failure is data that teaches you lessons.

Tell yourself *that* story.

You might feel some discomfort in the moment, but it won't break you, and you'll easily keep going.

TIPI, friends. Let's persevere. It's Separation Day, after all.

High School Highlights

Happy September!

Welcome to September! Hopefully cooler temperatures are on their way. At the high school, September will be a time when academic experiences will develop as the beginning of the year begins to fade away. In the athletic world, September will bring a number of games and tournaments; almost every weekend will be busy. September will also be a time where we will celebrate Hispanic Heritage Week (more to come on this next week). There will be no shortage of excitement this September.

Friday, September 5, 2025

On Friday, September 5, school will dismiss at 12:45 PM. Rehoboth will host the David Charles Cross Country Meet. This is a very fun event, and you are welcome to join us cheering on our runners. Parent pick up for all K-12 students will be in the loop behind the middle school. Bus loading will be on the Tse Yaniichii loop near the Fellowship Hall for that day.

Advanced Placement classes, exams, and fees

If your student is in 11th or 12th grade, they may be in an Advanced Placement (AP) class this year. Rehoboth offers AP Calculus, AP English, AP Precalculus, and AP US HIstory. These classes are wonderful opportunities full of academic rigor. The classes work toward an exam that is given by the College Board in May. Early in the year AP students are asked to register for those AP exams; the deadline for ordering those exams is November 15, so if you or your student wishes to change their registration status please let Mr. Weidenaar or the AP teacher before November 15. The AP exams are given by Rehoboth but are made by the College Board, so they come with an additional fee. That fee is \$99 or \$62. The lower price is based upon your free and reduced lunch status, so filling out that form and turning it in at the administration office is very important. (You can find it on pages 14-15 of this Parent News). The fees will be collected in the Spring.

Picture Day and Senior Pictures

Picture day is scheduled for October 1 and 2. Mark your calendars. These pictures will be used for student identification and yearbook photos. Even if you do not plan to order pictures, they are still important.

If your student is a senior, our yearbook advisor, Mr. Perkins, (or a member of the yearbook staff) will be requesting a suitable senior picture. Please provide that photo in a timely manner, and feel free to reach out to Mr. Perkins with any questions you may have regarding that photo.

Parent pick-up and drop-off

If you are dropping off or picking up students from the high school, please park in the main parking lot of the high school/sports and fitness center. Convenient spots for pick up are the parking spots on the east side of the lot. In the afternoon buses will be parked and loaded on the curb. Please ask your student to walk behind the buses to enter the parking lot.

Counseling Services

Rehoboth is in a great position to offer counseling services to high school students. Mr. Ensign is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC), and he strives to give students tools and ideas to help them better navigate their lives. He patiently listens and asks necessary questions to help students glimpse and grasp a flourishing life. If your student is in need of counseling students please contact Mr. Ensign (he prefers that you email him at densign@rcsnm.org), or you can contact Mr. Weidenaar and he will speak to Mr. Ensign.

Grade reports

Grade reports are sent out on Monday afternoons (this week it was a Tuesday afternoon). Please take a moment to look through the grade report, and please ask your student a few questions about that report. Ask what classes they enjoy, or what they are struggling with, or what is happening in specific classes. If your student is struggling in a class or failing a class do assure them that they can pass and that they can ask their teachers what will help them raise their grades. If your student is failing a class on the grade report they will not be able to travel or play games with their teams. However, those grades can and will be changed if students work to change them.






