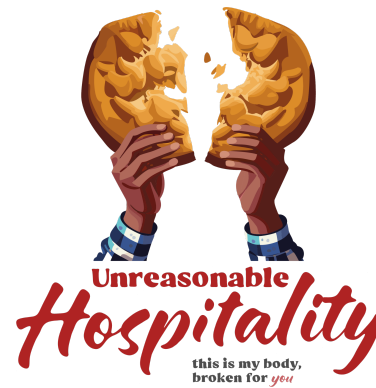

## Table Talk

If I think back to June, this was definitely the wettest summer we've had of the six years that we've lived in Gallup. The height and growth of all the vegetation on campus, not to mention the weeds in my yard, testify to the amount of moisture that the sky has unleashed over these last three months. A huge thank-you goes out to Brian Yazzie for his tireless work in keeping all of our campus greenery in check!

In addition to the gift of greenery, the summer monsoons have a dangerous side as well. Flash floods crash through arroyos and slot canyons during intense storms, and they can be lethal to people caught in those spaces.

Jesus was familiar with this phenomenon. In the deserts of Judea, dried out river beds called *wadis* criss-cross the landscape and often served as travel routes for traders and others wanting to avoid the mountain passes on their journeys. As is true for all deserts, rainfall is scarce in Judea, but on the occasion of a short burst (even in the faraway foothills), these wadis can become raging rivers of flash flood waters.

That's the setting for Jesus' famous parable of the wise and foolish builders. You know how it goes, right? Both men build houses that the rains beat against and the flood waters rise against, and one of the houses is destroyed because its foundation was built on the sand. The other house, however, was built on the rock; and it stands firm against the raging waters.

It's easy to think about this as a call to stay safe and separate from the world, but in the parable we see that both houses are subject to the chaos of the flooding. The difference is that one of the houses is built on the rock of living in step with God and His Kingdom vision for the world.

Our mission at Rehoboth calls us to challenge students to know the Triune God and equip them to love, serve, and transform the world in His name. The transformation we desire can't happen by staying secluded off in a corner somewhere. It requires us to produce students who can take everything they've learned and step out into those raging waters, knowing that they have a firm foundation on the rock.

In the chaos and holy . . . Not the tyranny of the "or," but the genius of the "and."

It's incredibly hard to live this way, but it is possible because of Christ's sacrifice for us. He has redeemed us from our own destruction and set us on the path of life. Thank you for embracing this calling with us here at Rehoboth.

## **Student Drop-offs and Pick-ups**

Kinder to 8th Grade families please use the Gravel Loop located behind our Mid School building to drop-off and pick-up students. Please refrain from picking up your student at the Elementary Playground/Parking Area. This area is reserved for our Pre-K families who have to park and drop-off/pick-up their students at the classroom door.

You may begin dropping off your student after 7:45 am until 8:05 am. Pick-up begins at 3:05 pm until 3:20pm, and on Thursday 1:35-1:50pm. After that, please walk into the office to pick-up your student. It is helpful for the office/classroom teacher to know if you are running late. If your student is eating breakfast, you may drop them off at the Sports and Fitness Center entrance.

Lastly, please drive with caution. We want to keep our students safe. Form a single drive-up lane and pull as far ahead as you can to make room for other cars. When pulling out and driving away, double check to make sure there are no students around. If you need help, please talk to our traffic/pick-up monitor or call the office.
