You never hear people cheering *against* anyone at a cross country meet. There's no, "Hey number 472! My grandma runs faster than you!" or "You're gonna trip, Kirtland! Who do you think you are, passing my daughter like that!"

As I watched the finish line from my perch in the sky, words from Hebrews chapter 12 kept running through my mind:

I know that for our families at Rehoboth, there is incredible value placed on the wisdom and support of our relatives—our grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, and extended family who love and nurture us throughout our lives. Those are the people I think of when I consider the "great cloud of witnesses" that the author of Hebrews writes about. And I imagine that teachers, classroom aides, administrators, coaches, and everyone else who is part of the Rehoboth staff are pushing their way up to the race boundary to add their cheers of encouragement and praise to our young people as they run their races.

There's a cloud of witnesses who care deeply about Rehoboth–our work here and its impact on your children. Draw strength from them as we "run with perseverance the race marked out for us." And let us commit to throwing off the things that entangle or distract us from our important jobs as partners in the education of our children. With that approach and the Lord's help, there's no course we can't conquer.

Student Drop-offs and Pick-ups

Kinder to 8th Grade families please use the Gravel Loop located behind our Mid School building to drop-off and pick-up students. Please refrain from picking up your student at the Elementary Playground/Parking Area. This area is reserved for our Pre-K families who have to park and drop-off/pick-up their students at the classroom door.

You may begin dropping off your student after 7:45 am until 8:05 am. Pick-up begins at 3:05 pm until 3:20pm, and on Thursday 1:35-1:50pm. After that, please walk into the office to pick-up your student. It is helpful for the office/classroom teacher to know if you are running late. If your student is eating breakfast, you may drop them off at the Sports and Fitness Center entrance.

Lastly, please drive with caution. We want to keep our students safe. Form a single drive-up lane and pull as far ahead as you can to make room for other cars. When pulling out and driving away, double check to make sure there are no students around. If you need help, please talk to our traffic/pick-up monitor or call the office.

Students in Grades 3, 4, and 5 will start their outdoor biking curriculum this Monday. Please make sure your child brings a water bottle to school and is wearing appropriate closed-toed shoes for riding a bike (no sandals, flip flops, or crocs).

Something awesome is happening in your child's physical education classes at school! We're very excited to tell you that your child will be participating in one of the most exhilarating and exciting childhood experiences: riding a bike!

The CYCLE Kids program is a fun, unique program that introduces children to the necessity of leading a more active lifestyle and helps them understand how to make better food choices. Your child will learn the importance of always wearing a bike helmet and how to fit it correctly, how to use hand signals and safely ride a bike, and how easy it can be to make healthier food choices. There are benefits to literacy and language learning, the program has driven essay contests and poetry circles in academic classes, and it helps build confidence and self-esteem in a child.

Underneath the excitement of riding a bike, our mission is simple; we support the health and academic development of your child. We know good health is holistic; research has shown inactive children also suffer academically, earning lower grades than their more active peers. The CYCLE Kids program helps build a child's confidence and improves their self-esteem, which carries over to their academic work. Community leaders, police officers, teachers, and you as parents are all key players in the success of the program, providing motivation and shaping a supportive environment where students thrive.

HOW CAN PARENTS HELP?

As part of this program, your child has been given a book, **"The Student and Parent Guide To Biking and Healthy Eating."** This book reinforces the lessons students are learning in their PhysEd class and more importantly, gives you and your child goals you can accomplish together. We encourage you, your child, and any other family members to work together to complete these activities and hope you become a healthier, and more tightly knit family, because of them!

Frequently asked questions:

- G: Does my child need a bike to participate in this program?
- A: No, CYCLE Kids provides the school with the bicycles and helmets for every student to use while participating in the program.

Q: How safe is cycling?

A: Safety is our first priority. Your child will learn the importance of always wearing a helmet and using hand signals. Additionally, only 10 children will be on the bikes at one time, allowing for more individualized attention and instruction.

Q: What nutrition lessons will my child learn?

A: Nutrition lessons are focused on activities you can practice at home, as well as at school. For example, lessons include understanding portion sizes and how to balance your plate.

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High School Highlights

Someone asked me recently if the honeymoon period of the year/new job was still going or had it ended. In many ways I think staff, parents, and students are still showing grace as I learn and perform the duties of my new principal position, and for that I am incredibly grateful. More importantly, I think the honeymoon period of the year for many teachers and students has ended. The failing grade report has been going out for a few weeks, and this week it has grown to include several students. Sometimes when students find themselves on the failing grade report they might not know to seek what are the factors that put them on the failing grade report, and often they do not ask for assistance in the classes they are failing. Families also might feel this sense of helplessness when they see the failing grade report. I do not want anyone to have this feeling. I assure you that the same grace that has been shown to me as I navigate my new position will be shown to students; communication is the key. Please ask questions of your student's teachers and encourage them to ask questions and seek assistance too. Trust me, the staff has incredible patience for those they see are learning and putting forth effort.
