#### **Table Talk**

Not many people think their lives are extraordinary.

For the last week, I have been interviewing Rehoboth students and alumni who exemplify the approach to life that we hope for all who experience our school. I've heard stories of selfless service; radical acts of kindness; life journeys that take people far, far away from here; and dedicated hearts that want to come back home to make a difference in this community.

And none of these people think that what they are doing is extraordinary.

We often see a similar phenomenon with our faculty when we ask for special lessons to highlight or interesting classroom stories to tell. Typically, our teachers don't think of their classrooms as something to crow about.

I thank God for so many humble hearts because ego can drive people into action that causes great harm. But on the other hand, we miss something if we don't take the time to celebrate each other and the work we are doing. Celebration is a form of encouragement and inspiration. It lets people know their efforts are seen and appreciated. And it often sparks ideas in others.

I think about how many of the alumni I talked to didn't plan on doing something big or fancy when they left Rehoboth to pursue their course of study. They weren't gunning to be special or to save the world. But they *were* open to different opportunities that God put in their path, and they considered what activities resonated in their hearts.

That's how the Spirit leads.

And it's never too early to start.

When you have a chance to talk with your child about their day of school, don't settle for, "Fine" as an answer. What assignments did you do? What topics did you read about? What questions do you have about what you learned? Did you notice anything unique?

As they talk, listen and look for what seems to excite them. Affirm that connection, and praise them for showing interest. You'll be planting seeds for an extraordinary life to feel "normal."

#### **Afternoon Pick-up Routines**

All K-8 students must be picked up at the **Gravel Loop** behind the Elementary and Middle School (unless riding the bus or at sports practice). The loop is **single lane only**-please pull forward, stay in line, and do not form a second lane. Use turn signals and exit slowly.

Families may park in the **SFC lot** and walk to the loop. Only Pre-K families may park by the Elementary playground (sign-out required). If you have students in both schools, you may park there, but all other students must still be picked up at the loop.

**Pick-up time is 3:05 to 3:25.** You will find students at the Gravel Loop.

- After 3:25, students are walked back inside to wait in the office where phone calls will be made.
- After 3:45, any students still waiting in the office will join the After School Program with Sarah Marlowe. After the second occurrence, the daily fee of \$15 per student will be applied.

#### **High School Highlights**

#### The Struggle of Learning

Earlier this week I was reading a review of a book about teaching reading and the science behind the teaching of reading. In the book one of the researchers wrote (about reading), "students should learn to be comfortable struggling." The thought there is that if students continue to struggle with difficult texts that they will grow as readers and as people if they have teachers and guides to help them figure out how to struggle effectively and make the most of their struggling. Later that day I wandered into a room where a small group of choir students were practicing a very difficult section of a song. The song asked the bass section to hit a very low note several times, and Mrs. Christensen had several strategies to help the singers struggle as they worked to reach that note and keep it on pitch. The work of practicing and eventually performing this difficult song will be a benefit to our choir members as they grow in their musicianship and lives through the struggle. This struggle is what we are all in together as we all work to educate your students at Rehoboth.

#### **Hispanic Heritage Week**

Hispanic heritage week has been awesome; students and teachers have been wearing so many cool things. Several classes have also done different activities to make this week special. The week wraps up on Friday evening with the Show n' Shine Car Show from 4-7pm. This is a fun event, please come and see the elaborate and artistic work car crafters put into their cars.

#### Parking on Friday, September 19 and Bus and Parent Pickup

The Show n' Shine Car Show will have many food trucks and vendors coming to the parking lot. These trucks and vendors will need to start setting up earlier in the afternoon to be ready for the event at 4pm. If your student drives to school, would you ask them to park on the far Southwest (by the church) part of the parking lot, or the parking lot for the Keith Kuipers Gym/Soccer Field. If students park in the main SFC parking lot, we will be asking them to move their vehicles immediately after school to make space for the car show.

#### **SAT and PSAT**

On Wednesday, October 15, our students will take the PSAT or SAT tests. This is an important test for our students and teachers. The results will give our teachers and students a great amount of data and information to think about where they are at academically and where they need to go. 


