

High School Highlights

Who Are You? What's Your Identity?

For chapel this week, SALT teacher, Nick Salazar, shared a powerful message with our students. There are lots of things that we identify ourselves with in life: our talents, our relationships, our academics, our culture, and so forth. Those qualities are all wonderful, but they can't serve as our ultimate identity, because in some way, they will fade over time, get broken, or fail us. Likewise, we can tend to define ourselves using negative factors like our hurts, our trauma, our addictions, our past mistakes and sins, etc. Satan wants us to short change the true identity we have by labeling ourselves as unloveable or not good enough. In the end, there's only one identity that will not fail–only one that will stay with us through all the ups and downs of life, and that's our identity in Christ. God created us in His image and provides us with a plan and a purpose for our lives; and He loves us enough to save us by grace–a gift that will never go bad. Take some time this week to talk with your children about the healthy things they use to identify themselves and reinforce to them that their ultimate worth comes from who they are in Christ, not what they accomplish. Likewise, find out if there are harmful conditions that your children see as permanent identifiers for themselves. Reinforce that they are not bound by pain or mistakes thanks to what the Lord has done for them.

First Quarter Coming to a Close

Believe it or not, there are just two weeks left in the first quarter of the school year! At Rehoboth, student's quarter grades serve as a progress report of how they are doing, and it's the semester grades that are stored on student transcripts as part of their permanent record. Nevertheless, the quarter is a good time to take stock of how things are going and what habits are proving successful vs. what habits need to change. Parents will have the opportunity to speak with their child's teachers on our two Parent-Teacher conference nights: Tuesday, October 10 and Wednesday, October 11. Both days, conferences will run from 4-8pm in the LC. No need to reserve a specific time slot.

Senior Night on Monday

The parents of our 9th-11th graders have each had an opportunity to learn about classes and credits, tests and service opportunities, and advice that will help students make the most of their high school years. That means that our Senior Parent Night is the only one left! Please plan to attend with your child on <u>Monday</u>, <u>September 25</u> to have all your questions answered about graduation, college & scholarship applications, Senior Trip, and much more. The event starts at 6pm in the LC of the high school.

PSAT/SAT Testing Day

On <u>Wednesday, October 11</u>, all the RCHS students will take standardized tests in the morning. Freshmen and sophomores will take the PSAT 8/9. Juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT; and seniors will take the SAT. For juniors and seniors, serious scholarship dollars and college admissions are tied to the results of these tests. For freshmen and sophomores, they serve as good practice for the higher stakes exams of their upperclassman years.


