Table Talk

At our weekly principals meeting, we're discussing a book called *The Culture Code*, by Daniel Coyle. It's a collection of his findings about how the best groups function after he spent two years studying companies, military units, professional sports teams, and several other types of groups.

The first principle he shares is that the best functioning groups are the ones in which people feel safe. Coyle gears his book toward groups that people engage with as part of their careers, but his observation is spot on when it comes to families and classrooms too. Since Rehoboth seeks to partner with families in educating and mentoring students, this is an observation we all should pay attention to.

People will flourish in groups where they feel safe.

The Lord offers us that safety time and time again in Scripture. A few examples:

"Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." - Matthew 11:28

"The name of the Lord is a strong tower. The righteous run to it and are safe." - Proverbs 18:10

"Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." - 1 Peter 5:7

As God's Living Images in this world, we should provide the same kind of safety for our children and family members at home and in the classrooms where they learn. But it takes consistent effort to make people feel safe, knowing that one bad interaction can undo a lot of good ones.

Coyle notes in his book, "A small signal [of belonging and safety] can have a huge effect, but the deeper thing to realize is that you can't just give [that message] once . . . It's a narrative—you have to keep it going. It's not unlike a romantic relationship. How often do you tell your partner that you love them? It may be true, but it's still important to let them know, over and over."

It's still important to let them know over and over.

That reminder hit me hard this week as something I need to work on myself. Let's all commit to creating cultures in our homes and certainly here in the classrooms of Rehoboth Christian School that mirror the kind of care and love our Lord and Savior has for us.

Afternoon Pick-up Routines

Thank you all for helping keep dismissal safe and smooth. We appreciate your willingness to be patient and picking up your students in the correct locations! Our teachers have also created a video of do's and don'ts of picking up students.

All K-8 students must be picked up at the **Gravel Loop** behind the Elementary and Middle School (unless riding the bus or at sports practice). The loop is **single lane only**—please pull forward, stay in line, and do not form a second lane. Use turn signals and exit slowly.

Families may park in the **SFC lot** and walk to the loop. Only Pre-K families may park by the Elementary playground (sign-out required). If you have students in both schools, you may park there, but all other students must still be picked up at the loop.

Pick-up time is 3:05 to 3:25. You will find students at the Gravel Loop.

- After 3:25, students are walked back inside to wait in the office where phone calls will be made.
- After 3:45, any students still waiting in the office will join the After School Program with Sarah Marlowe. After the second occurrence, the daily fee of \$15 per student will be applied.

End of Quarter 1

An attempt to change the trajectory of the quarter is best done before it is too late, so now would be the perfect time to make any changes that are necessary.

SAT and PSAT

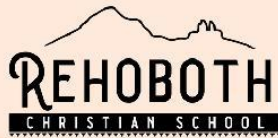

Scan Me

Orange shirt day began in Canada and is known as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. In the U.S., it is known as National Day of Remembrance. The orange shirt comes from residential school survivor Phyllis Webstad who wore her brand new orange shirt given by her grandmother on her first day. When she arrived to the mission school, the orange shirt was taken and never returned. 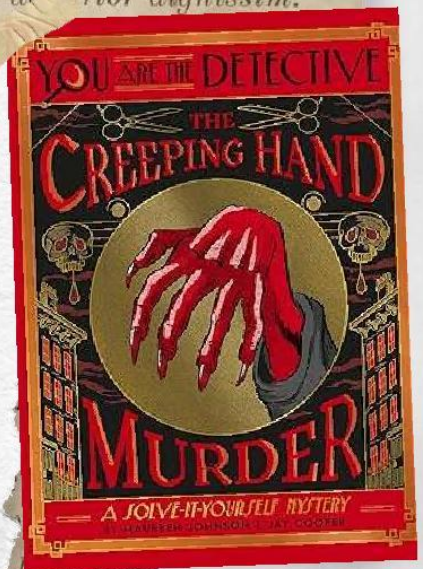
