High School Highlights

Lessons While Lost in Translation

For chapel this week, Chris Van Slooten shared several reflections, examples, and stories with our students about his time living and traveling abroad with his family—both in the Dominican Republic and Spain. There are plenty of times when languages use idioms or slang that is different from the literal meaning of those words, and Mr. V provided quite a few humorous examples. But then he talked about a response that people would give in the Dominican Republic when asked how they were doing: “Bien, gracias a Diós.”—meaning, “Good, thanks to God.” No matter who the person or what the situation, this was the people’s answer. It was baked into their way of thinking . . . and that’s what the Lord asks of us as well. We read that encouragement in I Thessalonians 5:16-18 “Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” We closed with a reading of those verses in English, Spanish, Navajo, and Zuni. Talk with your children about adopting a posture of gratitude to God and what that can do for our outlook and own joy in life as well.

First Quarter Coming to a Close

Just one week left in the first quarter of the school year! At Rehoboth, student’s quarter grades serve as a progress report of how they are doing, and it’s the semester grades that are stored on student transcripts as part of their permanent record. Nevertheless, the quarter is a good time to take stock of how things are going and what habits are proving successful vs. what habits need to change. Parents will have the opportunity to speak with teachers on our two Parent-Teacher conference nights: Tuesday, October 10 and Wednesday, October 11. Both days, conferences will run from 4-8pm in the LC. No need to reserve a specific time slot.

Band Concert and Fall Carnival

The first band concert of the year is scheduled for Monday, October 2. If you’re new to Rehoboth or to band music in general, you need to come to see the amazing work of our almost 70 band members.
