Yesterday was my wife's birthday.

We took her out to dinner when we were home from school and basketball practice, and it was a nice meal at Anthony's here in Gallup. We picked up some dessert to enjoy on the way home, and when we got back to the house, there was a surprise waiting. My wife had ordered three sweatshirts for herself and our two kids from a company called the Happiness Project. Betsy believes deeply in their mission to help erase the stigma surrounding mental health issues and to equip people with knowledge and tools to improve their mental health.

Their work is creative, fun, and important. Check them out if you have time.

But if I'm honest, part of me is sad that a company like the Happiness Project even has to exist. The fact is, mental health needs amongst all people in this country . . . but especially amongst young people . . . are higher and greater than they've ever been. That's hard, but it's reality.

One of Rehoboth's throughlines is *Justice Warriors*. Justice Warriors are people who recognize when things aren't right—when personal, organizational, or societal circumstances hurt people that the Lord intends to have flourish. And then, Justice Warriors do something about it.

Later this month, we're going to have our first of two parent information nights about some of the increased mental health challenges tied to the way we as adults and as young people interact with technology. You can find the dates and times here in the Parent News, but we'll be communicating in further detail about them in the days and weeks ahead too.

I hope you can attend one of the evenings. I know I speak for all of us at Rehoboth when I say that we absolutely love your kids. We want them to flourish as the Lord intended. They motivate us to get up every morning and give our very best effort in our work. We cheer on their successes with you, and we hurt when they hurt–just like you. Your partnership and trust in the education of your children means the world to me, and I look forward to speaking with you at our upcoming events.

<u>The Fidelity Scholars Program</u> is for historically underrepresented students from New Mexico, and a few other states. It is a last dollar scholarship that covers the remaining need after financial aid has been disbursed to the student. It can be used at any institution in the state (public or private) where the student resides and is for students with GPAs that are between 2.5-3.5. The application deadline is January 30.
