Table Talk

This past Tuesday, September 30th, Rehoboth joined with people across the US and Canada to recognize Orange Shirt Day. This tradition started in Canada, and it is also known as National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. I'm mentoring a principal at a Christian junior high school in Calgary, Alberta, Canada; and on our Tuesday phone call, he said that his school was also participating.

Like the United States, Canada has a history of Indigenous boarding schools that caused significant harm to Native peoples. Many of you know that Rehoboth was also a boarding school up until the turn of the 21st Century, and some of our alumni and former students from that time period feel similar hurt and pain from their experiences. It's important for us to have a humble posture about that—to resist the urge to defend ourselves or point out all of the people who had a great experience at Rehoboth.



Our school theme this year is *Rooted*. During our staff orientation in August, we looked at different types of trees that each had unique root stories. One was Pando—a massive grove of 47,000 aspens in Utah that is actually the world's largest single living organism fed by the same root system. Like Pando, Rehoboth alumni share roots with those from boarding schools in other places. There's a common identity that binds us together and is worth learning about, even if it makes us uncomfortable.

Getting to know people's stories is one of the best ways to let them know they matter. Just as the Lord hears our cries and prayers, so we need to demonstrate empathy for the life circumstances of our marginalized brothers and sisters in the school community. That's the first step to reconciliation. We draw strength and resilience from those who support us—even if their circumstances aren't the same as our own. Wearing orange on Tuesday was a way to lend support to Indigenous people across this country and Canada who have walked the hard road of boarding school and to let them know that their voices matter.

We strive to do good work that reflects God's Kingdom here at Rehoboth, and we need to celebrate the times when we get it right with the Lord's help. But we also need to tell the truth about the times (both in the past and the present) when we fall short and our words or actions marginalize our brothers and sisters rather than enfold them. That's the humble posture that will keep us mission-focused and moving down the right path for years to come.

So in the spirit of solidarity and in recognition of our common roots, thanks for wearing your orange this week. And if someone asks you why you did that, tell them God's story—a story of truth and reconciliation.

Afternoon Pick-up Routines

Thank you all for helping keep dismissal safe and smooth. We appreciate your willingness to be patient and picking up your students in the correct locations! Our teachers have also created a video of do's and don'ts of picking up students.

All K-8 students must be picked up at the **Gravel Loop** behind the Elementary and Middle School (unless riding the bus or at sports practice). The loop is **single lane only**—please pull forward, stay in line, and do not form a second lane. Use turn signals and exit slowly.

Families may park in the **SFC lot** and walk to the loop. Only Pre-K families may park by the Elementary playground (sign-out required). If you have students in both schools, you may park there, but all other students must still be picked up at the loop.

Pick-up time is 3:05 to 3:25. You will find students at the Gravel Loop.

- After 3:25, students are walked back inside to wait in the office where phone calls will be made.
- After 3:45, any students still waiting in the office will join the After School Program with Sarah Marlowe. After the second occurrence, the daily fee of \$15 per student will be applied.

End of Quarter 1 & Parent Teacher Conferences

The first quarter will end next week, Friday, October 10. Now is the time to ask your student how they are doing in classes, and check their grades with them. An attempt to change the trajectory of the quarter is best done before it is too late, so now would be the perfect time to make any changes that are necessary.

Parent teacher conferences will be October 14 and 15 from 4-8PM. This is a great opportunity to meet our high school teachers. This will be a great time to build a relationship with teachers; they will let you know about what happens with your student in class and what will be expected in the next quarter. Please plan on attending one of these evenings; there is no sign up necessary for high school conferences.

Fall Carnival & Band Concert

This year our band is huge, 77 students, and our choir is not small either at 54 students. The band plans to tour next year in April, and that will be an enormous undertaking. 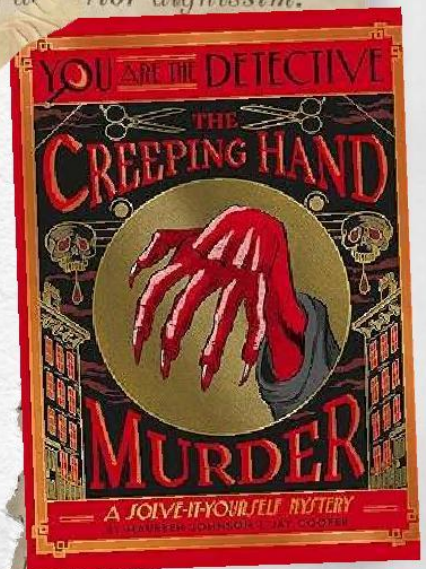
