Table Talk

Dan Meester | Executive Director

I'm in Michigan this week, sharing the Rehoboth story with different groups of our supporters, and today, I had the opportunity to be a part of an Education class at Calvin University–Inclusive Teaching, taught by Professor Tori Figg. They were excited to learn about Rehoboth and the tools we use to teach our students well.

The class is built around the concept of biblical hospitality and what it means to be a hospitable teacher, so I was excited to share about our theme from last school year—*Unreasonable Hospitality*—and some of the distinctives that I think make Rehoboth such a special place.

We talked about practical advice, like being prepared with your lesson materials so you can stand outside the class and greet students as they come in. That little extra effort helps teachers see things like body language, mood, eye contact for each student and start making mental adjustments to their interactions in class. Similarly, learning your students' stories, going to their sporting events, learning their language, and so many other efforts are all ways to demonstrate to your students that they matter. That they're worth your time. That they are important to the God we serve.

I'm happy these kinds of practices are embedded into the teaching of so many of our faculty. I get to see them on display when I walk through our buildings and pop into classrooms or when we're on trails, fields, or courts cheering on our teams. These are strong educational principles that make for better learning... but they're far more than that too.

Hospitality is at the heart of the behaviors that bring about the Kingdom of Heaven.

In Genesis, we read the story of Abraham bending over backwards to provide an extreme welcome for three strangers who are traveling through the land near his home. As he prepared a meal for them, Abraham instructed Sarah to get three "seahs" (about 20 pounds each) of the finest flour to make bread to nourish their visitors.

60 pounds of the *finest* flour. Some of you fry bread experts know that three big bags of blue bird flour could probably make enough dough for 150 people. 150 meals' worth for 3 guests. That's over the top, right? It's way beyond what they needed.

Later, in the book of Matthew, Jesus tells a parable about the Kingdom of Heaven, saying it's like a woman who added yeast to *three seahs of flour* until it worked itself all through the dough. He's directly pointing us back to that story of Abraham caring for three strangers.

We love and appreciate your students. They are worth our best efforts. They are worth knowing because they are Living Images of Almighty God. That posture leads to a great education, but even more, they embody the Kingdom of Heaven.






