

Table Talk

I started college in the state of Michigan in the fall of 1991. At that same time, another group of freshmen—Chris Webber, Jalen Rose, Juwan Howard, Jimmy King, and Ray Jackson began their college years about two hours away in Ann Arbor at the University of Michigan. You might remember them as the Fab Five, perhaps the greatest men's college basketball recruiting class ever assembled, who appeared in two straight national championship games before venturing off into the NBA.

Mitch Albom, at that time a reporter for the *Detroit Free Press*, shadowed the team during that era and later wrote a book about them called *Fab Five*. I loved reading about all the behind-the-scenes conversations and interactions that made up their time at Michigan. Some years later, Albom grew to wider fame as an author with his #1 bestsellers, *Tuesdays with Morrie* and *The Five People You Meet in Heaven*. Those books shared life wisdom about how to be a fulfilled human being, and they still inspire readers today.

I came across a Mitch Albom quote this week in a weekly email I subscribe to called, "The 3-Point Play." The email shares 3 nuggets of advice—one basketball tip, one leadership principle, and one life lesson. Mitch Albom's quote came in the "Life Lesson" section:

"So many people walk around with a meaningless life. They seem half-asleep, even when they're busy doing things they think are important. This is because they're chasing the wrong things. The way you get meaning into your life is to devote yourself to loving others, devote yourself to your community around you, and devote yourself to creating something that gives you purpose and meaning."

We have begun a new strategic planning process at Rehoboth—one that will give us a blueprint of goals for the next 5-10 years. As we've been discussing our school purpose within that plan, common themes keep emerging no matter who is in the room. These include the importance of relationships in a Rehoboth education and equipping students with a sense of purpose.

At Rehoboth, we base our life purpose and calling on the Bible. We're meant to put God on display for the world to see. But Mitch Albom is pretty on-target in his assessment here. When we follow Jesus' model and pour ourselves out for

others, something special happens. We get a glimpse of how things are supposed to be. It's what the apostle Paul calls "The life that is truly life" in 1 Timothy.

Today, I pray that for our students and for each of you, your daily life brings you ever closer to that kind of world-changing purpose and meaning... and may God be glorified through it all.


Thanksgiving Lunch

SAT & PSAT Results Coming Soon!

High school students took the SAT or PSAT on Wednesday, October 15. The results of this test will be emailed to your student and to us here at school some time in November. Please encourage your student to show you these results; the results are much more than a score. The test is broken down into several sections, and the sections are broken down into several different skills. The results page even has links to explain what those skills are and what could help your student improve in those particular skills. The results will also include a score, and that score is part of a percentile. That number reflects your student's place in the group of all students who took the PSAT/SAT. If you need help navigating through those results or you or your student did not get those results, please contact Ms. Lynch or Mr. Weidenaar.

Celebration of Learning




