Table Talk

With Thanksgiving coming up next week, many of us will spend time with family—including family that we don't always see that often.

Ask someone about their anticipation of those family times, and you may hear excitement. Some people can't wait to connect with their relatives and hear the stories of what everyone has been up to, tell the jokes that make us laugh, or feel the warm embrace of people who love us.

For others, spending time with family over the holidays can be tricky. There might be long-held grudges at play or divisive viewpoints on politics or religion. Maybe you have a cousin who can't wait to stir the pot and poke at people in ways that are sure to bring out hard feelings.

On those kinds of occasions, it can be exhausting to keep our tongues in check, maintain our cool, and not "make a scene" that ruins the day for everyone. When I was a child, I was blissfully unaware of these sorts of dynamics at work, but as I've grown older, I'm more cognizant of the snark or the jealousy that might be simmering just below the surface of our conversations.

I came across and was reminded of some advice lately that may serve you well if you have to navigate any tricky dynamics over the holidays. The first is some hard-won wisdom from Jocko Willink, a former Navy Seal commander who has become one of my favorite leadership thinkers:

"Speaking angrily to others is ineffective. Losing your temper is a sign of weakness. The aggression that wins on the battlefield, in business, or in life is directed not toward people but toward solving problems, achieving goals, and accomplishing the mission."

I don't mean to compare family get-togethers to war. I certainly hope that's not the case for you, but Willink is right in that getting upset rarely makes a situation better. It won't unite people or bend them to your will. See if you can take the high road and look to build other people up—even if you're feeling annoyed with them.

The next bit of advice comes from God's Word. Perhaps you've heard the passage before from the book of Proverbs: "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." - Proverbs 15:1

I pray that the chances you have to gather with family during the holidays are filled with joy, but if some of them will be tougher for you, I pray that you can shine the light of Christ into those moments by being gentle and generous in the way you deal with and speak to others. In a world that says we should be looking for a fight around every corner, the gentle approach signals something truly different about the Kingdom of the God we serve. Blessings to you all!

Patience Tool:

"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." - Isaiah 40:31

Patience is important because it helps us navigate challenges with a clear head, make better decisions, and achieve long-term goals. Patience, combined with other tools (empathy, breathing, and words tools) helps us avoid saying hurtful things in the heat of the moment. Being patient with others involves staying calm when faced with frustration, understanding different perspectives, and responding thoughtfully instead of impulsively.

Being patient with ourselves means acknowledging our imperfections and treating yourself with the same kindness you would a friend. It also means to delay gratification for a more positive outcome.
