Table Talk

Last weekend, my wife and I were driving back home from Roswell after watching our boys soccer team in the state quarterfinals. Looking out the window, we saw what we first thought were a herd of deer, but after looking more closely, we realized they were pronghorns—beautiful animals indeed!

Seeing those pronghorns reminded me of our trips to Israel—one of them with Rehoboth staff in the summer of 2022. On that trip, we spent a day at Ein Gedi, an Israeli national park centered around an oasis in the middle of the Judean desert right next to the Dead Sea. Ein Gedi is a place full of waterfalls, plant life, and abundant animals. When we first entered the park, our eyes were drawn to the cliffs above where we saw deer-like animals called ibex bounding along the cliffs in places where it looked like they had no business being.



"He made my feet like the feet of a deer and set me secure on the mountain heights." - Psalm 18:3

David wrote Psalm 18 as a declaration of praise to God for delivering him from his enemies, enemies like Saul who was searching out David to kill him and wipe out this rival to his throne. During those days, David spent a lot of time hiding in the caves at Ein Gedi, and he would have undoubtedly seen ibex picking their way over the impossible terrain. The animal that the translators call "deer" in Psalm 18 and other places is almost surely one of these ibex.

David's praise in Psalm 18 gives us insight into the perspective of God's people. On our trip, our teacher told us that David praised God for giving him ibex-like feet that could stay safe on the dangerous paths through the mountains—a metaphor for the rough, painful, trying experiences he was going through. And that's just it. Putting our faith in God doesn't mean praying for a smooth and easy path. It means trusting that when things get rough (which we all know they will), God will give us the feet to persevere and make it through those moments.

As we gear up for Thanksgiving, one of my prayers is that we become a lot better at recognizing the gift of ibex feet, rather than wishing for an easier life. The Lord loves us enough to walk with us in the tough times, and that's our commitment to you and your children at Rehoboth as well.


