"But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons" (Galatians 4:4-5).

When the fullness of time had come ...

I once heard a Christmas sermon preached on this passage, and it explained that this phrase "the fullness of time" means "at exactly the right time." God sent Jesus at exactly the right time.

At the time of Jesus' birth, the brutal Roman Empire ruled most of the known world. For God's people, that rule came at a heavy price. They were taxed mercilessly. They were forbidden to pledge their allegiance to anyone but Caesar—a crime punishable by crucifixion. Jews caught reading Torah could be flayed. Keeping the Sabbath could get you burned alive. Mothers were forced to watch their children tortured in front of them.

It was horrific in every sense of the word.

And it was at this exact moment that God chose to send His son into the world. The contrast couldn't have been sharper. On the one hand, you had an empire built on power, violence, blood, and destruction. On the other hand, you had Jesus, preaching and modeling a Kingdom of peace, love for our enemies, lifting up the marginalized, and a willingness to lay down our lives for others.

Christ's deliverance comes in the middle of Chaos. "A light shines in the darkness," says John.

Perhaps you are in the midst of darkness right now. Maybe you have a friend or a family member who is battling Chaos and demons at every turn. When everything feels horrific . . . when we're at the lowest depths of human experience . . . that's when Christ shows up.

In the fullness of time, He came for His people.

And in the fullness of time, He comes for you and for me. Let that light shine in the midst of our darkness this Christmas season, and may we see and hear clearly the invitation into the beautiful Kingdom of God.

In this my first semester as principal I received enormous amounts of support and encouragement from parents and families, and I want to thank you for it. There has been much to learn this semester, and I am still trying to learn about this job and how to do it well, so thank you for your patience with me as well as your support. This week I have asked students to turn in their phones at the beginning of the day. We as a staff thought it would be a great opportunity for our students to free themselves and their attention from the constant distractions that come from phones. Many students attempted this with many different results, and you should ask your students about this week. Did they participate? And what did they notice about their attention and day in general if they did? If they did not participate, what did they notice about the students who did? And what would a day without a phone look like to them in their imaginings. Even the smallest conversations will get your student thinking.

Next week is exam week, and teachers and students are eagerly (or fearfully) preparing for those exams and end of the semester projects. Please ask your students what is due and when, and what they still need to turn in that is past due. This way we can have an exam week that is much less fearful and stressful and much more productive.

#### RCHS First Semester Exam Schedule — December 2024

As a reminder and for those who are taking high school exams for the first time: Students do not need to be at school if they do not have a scheduled exam for a given time slot. However, if they are in school, they must report to their scheduled class and teacher. Students will take their exams during the scheduled time for their class period, unless authorized by their teacher. Students must report on time for their exams, and late arriving students will not be admitted to their exams.

When finished with exams for the day, students may sign out with parent permission if they have transportation home. Students must stay in their designated rooms or study spaces both before and during exam periods. If students miss an exam period, they can make it up on Thursday 12/19 or during another exam period when they are not already taking a test. 
