Students shared about the amazing intricacies of God's creation of the world we live in and our own bodies. God provides for Christian education, teachers, family, and church. These things demonstrate our global connectedness through our amazing God!

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High School Highlights

Ash Wednesday and the Beginning of Lent

Yesterday (Ash Wednesday) was the beginning of Lent–a unique time. On Ash Wednesday, millions of people around the world attend church services where they have ashes smeared on their foreheads in the shape of a cross and thus walk around with the visual equivalent of a big old sign hanging around their necks declaring, "I am a Christian!" for all the world to see. The Lenten journey ends on the glorious mountaintop of Easter, but Ash Wednesday marks the first steps that take us down into the valley as we are reminded of Christ's descent to earth, His rejection, humiliation, and death. In those meditative moments we are also confronted by our own mortality, our own guilt, and our own shame. "For you are dust, and to dust you shall return," say pastors as they smear the ash on our brows. The ash takes us to the dark places, the places of loneliness and chaos–even death.

At *my* Ash Wednesday service a few years back, the pastor preached on the story of post-resurrection Jesus on the shore of the Sea of Galilee reinstating Peter, confronting the guilt and shame of the disciple who denied him three times when he had declared so vehemently that he would never do such a thing. But in Peter's ashes, Christ was there–rebuilding their relationship, calling him anew to follow Him and feed His lambs.

And that story made my mind wander to the previous verses of that episode out of John–when the disciples are hauling in their massive catch and bringing the boat back to the shore for breakfast. Jesus waits for them there, tending a fire "of burning coals." A seemingly insignificant detail, right? Not for those of us from Rehoboth who have traveled to Israel! In orienting us for the trip, our guide pointed out that verse and tied it to two other passages–ones that had always left me baffled. Romans 12 and Proverbs 25 both contain an unusual exhortation for us: "If your enemy is hungry, feed him. If he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head."

My whole life, when I'd hear those passages, I would be thinking, "What???!" Are we supposed to purposefully shame our enemies? That never seemed like the best way to convince people of the gospel, and I always wrestled with what felt like a command to take sadistic joy in how uncomfortable our kindness would make someone else.

But then our guide pointed us to another passage: David's Song of Deliverance in 2 Samuel 22, which is echoed in various Psalms as well. "In my distress I called to the Lord; From his temple he heard my voice; . . . smoke rose from his nostrils; consuming fire came from his mouth, burning coals blazed out of it." Burning coals are a pictorial, metaphorical reminder that God is present. And sure enough, it makes sense—the burning bush, the pillar of fire guiding the Israelites, the tongues of flame on Pentecost. So heaping burning coals on your enemy's head means being a picture of God to them—a Living Image, if you will.

In our ashes, beneath the burning coals, God is there; and in each other's ashes we need to be there too if we are to be His pictures in this world. No matter what we are going through, God is holding us, shaping us, and supporting us on this journey. And if we are to be people who bear His mark, who embody Him to the rest of the world, then we need to be here for each other too. Brothers and sisters, God is with us, drawing us close, preparing us for the work of the Kingdom. We need to do the same. That's my reminder and my encouragement to you today.

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Scholarships for Seniors

- The Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance Application will open on Friday, March 15, 2024. I encourage any student(s) that would like to apply to obtain an original (duplicate) copy of their Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB) from the Department of Vital Records. The Navajo Nation Scholarship Office will require you to submit an original copy of your CIB with your application.
- First Financial Credit Union Scholarship Application is now Open!
 - Must be a graduating senior in good standing, planning to attend a two or four-year, accredited New Mexico college or university, or currently enrolled at a New Mexico institution of higher learning.
 - Must be enrolled as a full-time student with a minimum of 12 hours and must have at least a 2.0 grade point average.
 - Parent/guardian or student must be a member of First Financial Credit Union. Immediate family members of volunteers and staff are not eligible.
 - Completed application must be submitted by **midnight Wednesday**, April 17th, 2024.
- Continental Divide Electric Cooperative's Education Foundation will accept scholarship applications for the 2024-25 school year. PLEASE NOTE: The deadline to return applications is March 31, 2024.

New Student applications for the 2024-2025 year:

The new student applications are now available. If you are a current parent interested in adding an additional child, you can fill out an application within your Family Portal account. When completed we will be connecting with you on the next steps. If you know anyone interested in applying, they can start an <u>application online here</u>.

Re-enrolling for the 2024-2025 year:

We had asked all current parents to re-enroll by January 31st .This helps us determine the seats we can offer new potential students. New student admission applications opened today and we will be offering seats for next school year.

Other Scholarships:

ACE Scholarship

The application became available on Monday, February 5th and the deadline is April 15th. We are still working with FACTS to have them set up the payment of the application fee. You can still start the application but if you get to the screen that asks for payment, save your application for later. *Check your email* from Feb 12th for updated information on how to apply. <u>Make sure you fill out the information (create your account if you don't have a FACTS account already) under the first login (login website) before you go to the next login page to start the ACE scholarship application.</u>

Parents will receive an email on specifics but here are some other details to note when applying:

- 1. We will be taking care of the application fee
- 2. Arizona families can apply
- 3. Applications are one per family
- 4. Please fill out if you are financially eligible ASAP, see below.. Be sure to upload all the documents needed.
- 5. To complete, you need the following:
 - a. 2023 tax forms
 - b. Social security, disability, housing allowance, food stamps, child support documentation, and any documentation of additional sources of income that are not reported on your 1040.


Food Service
