Last week Tuesday was a special ribbon cutting ceremony at the middle school for the building's recently installed solar panels. The mayor, our city council representative, and our board president all attended, and the local folks who passionately pursued and sponsored this project had a chance to be recognized as well. Our middle school students did a great job in the ceremony–reading Scripture, praying, and cutting the ribbon.

We expect to save about \$15,000 each year off the middle school electrical bills as a result of the panels. I appreciate Rehoboth's commitment to keeping Christian education affordable for all families who want it for their children, and this is just one example of the steps we take to achieve that. I also love the way the solar project falls in line with one of our throughlines: Creation Keepers. We want our students, both now and in the future, to care for the land and its resources. That's not just "being green." It's actually part of the Lord's will for us as human beings.

The sun that we are harnessing for electricity today has held significance for people all the way back to ancient times. Some cultures worshipped it as a deity, while others realized its role in marking time—both daily and seasonally. A favorite Psalm of mine (Psalm 113) shows how the sun reminds us of God's majesty and mission.

From the rising of the sun to the place where it sets,

the name of the Lord is to be praised.

The Lord is exalted over all the nations, his glory above the heavens

He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ash heap; he seats them with princes, with the princes of his people.

He settles the childless woman in her home as a happy mother of children.

Praise the Lord.

In all times and in all places, this is the God we serve. This is the God your children are learning to love and follow. This is the God who lifts us up when we are low and offers hope when all else seems dark. As you feel the sun on your face today, may you all be reminded of this as well.

Re-Enrollment for Current Families is now available

Please go <u>HERE</u> to the family portal to re-enroll. *District code is re-nm*. If you don't remember your password you can reset it or call 505-863-4412 and we can do that for you. Thanks.

ACE Scholarship

The ACE Scholarship application is now open and available for the 2025-2026 school year to all families who fall in the financial guidelines categories seen <u>HERE</u>. This is an external scholarship that is available from a foundation that believes all children should have access to quality education. It is well worth applying for this scholarship as the recipients can receive around \$3000-\$4000 towards tuition. Deadline is April 15.

As Rehoboth has contracted with FACTS/ACE to pay the application fee, there are <u>two applications</u> that need to be filled out.

The first application is the Rehoboth application (for the fee waiver). The second application is the ACE scholarship. If you skip the first application the page to pay the application fee will come up on the ACE scholarship and you will not be able to submit the scholarship without paying the \$35 fee. Please fill out both applications in the order listed above. You can submit the ACE scholarship before you have your taxes done and then go back to upload your documents. Ace will email you a reminder of what documents you need to upload.

If you are adding any new students this year please add their names to the ACE scholarship even though they are not admitted yet.

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
Elementary News
