Table Talk Dan Meester | Executive Director

I had the pleasure of sitting in for our elementary/middle school principal, Mrs. DeYoung, for a couple of days this week while she was attending a conference in Florida. It gave me the opportunity to wander through the classrooms and watch our teachers and students in action. I also sat in on some conversations with both staff and students who were going through some rough patches.

Both of those experiences highlight the great work being done at Rehoboth and the amount of effort that work requires. It's not easy to plan well for all the little transitions and activities that happen during a 7-hour school day, but our teachers lead class like maestros. It's not easy to stick your neck out and ask a question when you're afraid of how it will make you look to your classmates, but our students are learning to do just that. It's not easy to take the time to unpack all the reasons behind a child's choices or behaviors and then help them regulate their emotions, restore relationships, and get back on track; but our counselors and SALT teachers shine in those moments.



Good things don't just happen by chance. They require hard work.

Our school mission statement says that we're equipping kids to love and serve God ... and <u>transform the world</u> in His name. That's a big job, full of obstacles and challenges that want to throw us off the path.

A copy of the book, *Do Hard Things*, sits on the shelf here in my office. It was written about 15 years ago as an encouragement to teens to overcome the low expectations that society often has for them, and instead live into the high expectations God has for them. While I don't agree with everything in the book, I love its overall posture and call to young people to make their lives matter for the Lord and His Kingdom right now.

The reason we are able to do hard things is because God has our back. Joshua 1:9 says, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." We love using that verse with our basketball team as a reminder that they aren't alone. Aside from giving us His Holy Spirit, the Lord also puts other people in our lives who can help us do hard things–who can help us keep going when we feel like we have nothing left. Rehoboth is a community in which we're called to lift each other up and bear each other's burdens. With that mindset and with the help of our Almighty God, we can, indeed, do hard things.

Re-Enrollment for Current Families is now available

Please go <u>HERE</u> to the family portal to re-enroll. *District code is re-nm*. If you don't remember your password you can reset it or call 505-863-4412 and we can do that for you. Thanks.

ACE Scholarship

The ACE Scholarship application is now open and available for the 2025-2026 school year to all families who fall in the financial guidelines categories seen <u>HERE</u>. This is an external scholarship that is available from a foundation that believes all children should have access to quality education. It is well worth applying for this scholarship as the recipients can receive around \$3000-\$4000 towards tuition. <u>Deadline is April 15.</u>

As Rehoboth has contracted with FACTS/ACE to pay the application fee, there are <u>two applications</u> that need to be filled out.

The first application is the Rehoboth application (for the fee waiver). The second application is the ACE scholarship. If you skip the first application the page to pay the application fee will come up on the ACE scholarship and you will not be able to submit the scholarship without paying the \$35 fee. Please fill out <u>both</u> <u>applications</u> in the order listed above. You can submit the ACE scholarship before you have your taxes done and then go back to upload your documents. Ace will email you a reminder of what documents you need to upload. If you are adding any new students this year please add their names to the ACE scholarship even though they are not admitted yet.

From the School Nurse:

A measles outbreak has been declared in Lea County (Southeast corner of NM). It is suspected to have started in Texas and spread into New Mexico. While this is far from Gallup, I want families to be aware and prepared in case the outbreak continues to spread through the state.

Measles: it isn't just a little rash! Measles can be dangerous, especially for babies and young children.

Measles symptoms typically include:

- High fever (may spike to more than 104°F)
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Rash breaks out 3-5 days after symptoms begin

Measles can be serious

- About 1 out of 5 people who get measles will be hospitalized.
- 1 out of every 1,000 people with measles will develop brain swelling due to infection (encephalitis), which may lead to brain damage.
- 1 to 3 out of 1,000 people with measles will die, even with the best care.
- You have the power to protect your child. Provide your children with safe long-lasting protection against measles by making sure they get the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine according to CDC's recommended immunization schedule.

As the weather is slowly starting to warm up, that means that Road Construction will be more present in our surrounding area. As of now, there will be a road improvement project on HWY 66 from the Rehoboth tunnel entrance to the Churchrock bridge turn-off. This may affect the Crownpoint Route Bus since it uses that road for the AM/PM Route. Although road construction can test our patience, we are glad that there will be safety and road improvements.
