### **Table Talk**

In the midst of all the Homecoming activities last week, the students at Rehoboth had a special opportunity to connect with The African Children's Choir, made up of boys and girls ages 8-10 from the country of Uganda. They performed with amazing energy and joy, but in addition to singing and dancing, they taught our students about daily life in Uganda. Rehoboth kids could relate to some of the descriptions—like having to haul their own water to their homes. We know that for many of our students and their relatives, this is a normal occurrence too . . . although we are much more likely to use our vehicles to make the trip, rather than walking to and from the well with a large jug on our heads!

The children also shared their dreams for their own futures. They wanted to be teachers, doctors, lawyers, engineers, and even hairstylists when they grew up. It was inspiring to gain insight into their lives and find common ground as human beings. That's an incredibly important skill in today's world, and it's something we strive to equip our students with during their Rehoboth education. Learning about others, especially when they are different from ourselves, gives us the gifts of empathy and broader perspective that lead to wiser decisions about how to live our lives and make an impact on our communities and the world at large.

Next week is International Heritage Week here at school. Students will have the chance to try food from different cultures, hear international presenters in classes, and even see some of the clothing or regalia celebrated by different cultural groups. Those opportunities are helpful academically and socially, but even more so, they reflect something vital about our Creator.

The Lord delights in diversity! We see amazing variety all over the universe when we look at unique planets and stars, nebulae and comets, gas clouds and galaxies that look like an artist painted them. Here on earth, we encounter rock formations of all shapes, colors, and sizes; plants whose colors fill us with awe; and more species of animals, birds, and insects than we can count.

In light of all that, it's amazing to hear the Lord call humankind "the crowning glory of His creation," and it's in other people that we most clearly see the Image of God represented in so many unique ways. No wonder that the book of Revelation describes the new heaven and the new earth as a place of great diversity too. "After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb," says Revelation 7:9. When we recognize and celebrate that same diversity here and now, we are rehearsing the Kingdom to come. I'm so glad Rehoboth is a place where we can support each other in this important work!

The ACE Scholarship application is now open and available for the 2025-2026 school year to all families who fall in the financial guidelines categories seen <u>HERE</u>. ## **High School Highlights**

David Brooks is a writer whose words I have considered deeply for much of the past two decades. I find his work to be necessarily challenging; the challenges in those thoughts have inspired me in many areas. Please permit me a long quote from his book called, *The Second Mountain*:

When you are in your distraction, untethered to actual commitments, focusing your attention is precisely what you cannot do. Your mind is afloat and at the play of prompts. Do not flatter yourself in thinking that you're brave enough or capable enough to see into the deepest and most important parts of yourself. One of the reasons you are rushing about is because you are running away from yourself. You know that at some point you should sit down and find some overall direction for your life. But the mind wants to wander from the meaty big questions, which are completely daunting and unanswerable, to the diverting candy right on your phone-the tiny dopamine lift.

All of this points in one direction: into the ditch. The person who graduates from school and pursues an aesthetic pattern of life often ends up in the ditch. It's only then that they realize the truth that somehow nobody told them: Freedom sucks.

Political freedom is great. But personal, social, and emotional freedom-when it becomes the ultimate end-absolutely sucks. It leads to a random, busy life with no discernible direction, no firm foundation, and in which, as Marx put it, all that's solid melts to air. It turns out freedom isn't an ocean you want to spend your life in. Freedom is a river you want to get across so you can plant yourself on the other side-and fully commit to something.

On Monday, February 10 Rehoboth will become a phone free school. That decision was made with the commitments our students would make in the future in mind. We deeply want our students to fully commit to their families, communities, and the work that God calls them to do. We believe that in true commitment people find deep, self-transcending joy as they work toward serving God and bringing His kingdom near.
