As the school chaplain, I'm often asked to walk with students, families, staff, and graduates through the difficult and dark spaces of grief, trauma, fear, and anxiety. Recently I have been reflecting on Psalm 23:4-5,

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies..."

There are two statements in these verses I wish I could change. I wish it said, "I get to walk *around*, or *past*, the valley of the shadow of death." I wish it said, "You prepare a table before me *away from* the presence of my enemies..." But the reality is, we live in the valley of the shadow of death. We live in a world where enemies such as sickness, financial problems, relational conflict, sin, evil, and death are always present in one way or another. Yet the author of the Psalm states, *"I will fear no evil, for You are with me…You prepare a table before me…*" A couple of weeks ago, I officiated the funeral of a friend of mine. He had suffered from diabetes for nearly thirty years. Sickness, limitations, and the reality of death had been his constant companions for years. However, he was a man who consistently displayed love, joy, and peace. His secret to his joy and peace was that he knew Jesus was with him. And secondly, he would often spend time letting Jesus feed his soul at the table of His Word. Jesus said, *"Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.*" (Matt. 4:4) Psalm 119:28 says, *"My soul melts away for sorrow; strengthen me according to your word!*" God gave us the Bible that we might be encouraged by His love, and be firm in hope, even when surrounded by enemies. It's my prayer for each one reading this that you and your family will regularly take time to dine at the table of God's Word, and that as you do, God will strengthen and nourish you. God bless you!

ACE Scholarship of New Mexico

This is a great scholarship for parents who are sending their students to a tuition- based private school like Rehoboth. They offer from \$1000 - \$4000 per student depending on grade. In order to get this scholarship for next year, you do need to apply for it by **April 15, 2024.** Please follow the complete instructions and details under the Inside Scoop section starting on page 8. Here is a chart of the income -financial guidelines to see if you qualify. Those who received this scholarship last year must reapply but you do not need to download your 2023 taxes.

Happy Easter

It's always amazing to me to reflect on the death and resurrection of Jesus on our behalf. A couple summers ago, many of us from the Rehoboth staff traveled to Israel together to learn more about the Bible and how it should impact our lives. We spent time in Jerusalem toward the end of the trip, and we walked the road down the Mount of Olives that Christ would have taken on Palm Sunday. We paced the Via Dolorosa that Jesus took on His way to the cross. We went into the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and saw probable locations for Jesus's crucifixion and tomb.

It wasn't that those places gave off some kind of magical energy, but as our guide was fond of saying about our visits, "It doesn't make it more holy, but it makes it a whole lot more real" to see and walk these paths. Jesus is the Son of God–fully divine; but He is also fully human. I can better imagine His fear and pain as the certainty of His death drew closer and closer. The price He paid for us was not small. It demanded *everything* from Him. And He gave it willingly.

You may feel like you don't deserve that kind of love and sacrifice. You may worry that you aren't living up to God's expectations for your life. Or you just may not see any value in who you are as a human being. Let this Easter weekend be a reminder to you that the actual living God who created and sustains the universe "took on flesh" and suffered real pain and cruelty as He paid our debt once and for all. Nothing you can ever do will undo that redemption, and as the sun rises on this Easter morning, I pray that the glory and power of that realization will give you peace like you've never known. Happy Easter, friends.

The new student applications are now available. If you are a current parent interested in adding an additional child, you can fill out an application within your Family Portal account. When completed we will be connecting with you on the next steps. If you know anyone interested in applying, they can start an <u>application online here</u>.

ACE Scholarship: It is very important that you use these links below to login. You will first have to update your FACTS account then go to another link to fill out the ACE Scholarship application. Again, this is a free and if a payment portion comes up for you, you need to log out and use the steps below to connect it all.

Go here First: We are finding out that the incorrect website URL is being used for your FACTS signin- <u>don't use the</u> <u>URL you used last year.</u>

Instead, use the following link <u>HERE (https://online.factsmgt.com/grant-aid/inst/46T5C/landing-page</u>) this will connect you with Rehoboth Christian School. If Rehoboth Christian School comes up you are using the correct website and you can select the year 2024-2025 and answer all the required questions - you can also download your 2023 tax documents here. Make sure you submit it. If Rehoboth Christian School does <u>not</u> come up, then you are not using the right URL for the website, go back and use the link. If the ACE scholarship is still asking you to pay then you have not connected with Rehoboth Christian School. **YOU SHOULD NOT BE PAYING FOR THE ACE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**. Please start over with the first link.

Here are some other details to note when applying:

- 1. We will be taking care of the application fee
- 2. The application deadline is April 15th.
- 3. Arizona families can apply
- 4. Applications are one per family
- 5. Please fill out if you are financially eligible ASAP, see below.. Be sure to upload all the documents needed.
- 6. To complete, you need the following:
 - a. 2023 tax forms
 - b. Social security, disability, housing allowance, food stamps, child support documentation, and any documentation of additional sources of income that are not reported on your 1040.

Lynx Scholarship:

If there are circumstances that are making it difficult for you to pay your tuition, you can apply for the <u>LYNX</u> <u>SCHOLARSHIPS</u>.

Tuition payments: A reminder that every month, a tuition payment needs to be paid. You can make your payments by phone through credit (505-863-4412), at our administration building, mail in payment, or use our free service of <u>FACTS</u>. Every credit card payment has a fee.


