Yesterday was Ash Wednesday on the church calendar-the beginning of the season of Lent. This season ends on the glorious mountaintop of Easter, but Ash Wednesday marks the first steps that take us down into the valley as we are reminded of Christ's descent to earth, His rejection, humiliation, and death. In those meditative moments we are also confronted by our own mortality, our own guilt, and our own shame. "For you are dust, and to dust you shall return," my pastor used to say as he smeared the ash on my brow at the Ash Wednesday night church service. The ash takes us to the dark places, the places of loneliness and chaos-even death.

There's a story in the book of John about post-resurrection Jesus on the shore of the Sea of Galilee reinstating Peter as a disciple, confronting the guilt and shame of the friend who denied him three times when he had declared so vehemently that he would never do such a thing. But in Peter's ashes, Christ was there–rebuilding their relationship, calling him anew to follow Him and feed His lambs.

Our mission at Rehoboth calls us to equip students to love, serve, and transform the world in God's name. Doing that means confronting the chaos of idolatry, lies, hate, oppression, addiction, and abuse. It means being willing to wade in scary, dark places, neck-deep at times. And it may feel like we're covered head to toe in the ashes.

But God is here with us like he was with Peter.

And if we are to be people who embody Him to the rest of the world, then we need to support our students. And each other.

And anyone else who looks like they need it.

It doesn't matter if we're long-time members of the community who bleed Rehoboth maroon and gold or if we're here for the first time this year. We partner together through the hard things, and we come out stronger for it in the end.

Brothers and sisters, God is with us-preparing us for the work of the Kingdom. As people who bear his mark, we need to do the same. That's my reminder and my encouragement to you today.

#### **ACE Scholarship**

The ACE Scholarship application is now open and available for the 2025-2026 school year to all families who fall in the financial guidelines categories seen <u>HERE</u>. This is an external scholarship that is available from a foundation that believes all children should have access to quality education. It is well worth applying for this scholarship as the recipients can receive around \$3000-\$4000 towards tuition. <u>Deadline is April 15.</u>

## As Rehoboth has contracted with FACTS/ACE to pay the application fee, there are <u>two applications</u> that need to be filled out.

The first application is the Rehoboth application (for the fee waiver). The second application is the ACE scholarship. If you skip the first application the page to pay the application fee will come up on the ACE scholarship and you will not be able to submit the scholarship without paying the \$35 fee. Please fill out <u>both</u> <u>applications</u> in the order listed above. You can submit the ACE scholarship before you have your taxes done and then go back to upload your documents. Ace will email you a reminder of what documents you need to upload. If you are adding any new students this year please add their names to the ACE scholarship even though they are not admitted yet.

#### From the School Nurse:

A measles outbreak has been declared in Lea County (Southeast corner of NM). It is suspected to have started in Texas and spread into New Mexico. While this is far from Gallup, I want families to be aware and prepared in case the outbreak continues to spread through the state.

Measles: it isn't just a little rash! Measles can be dangerous, especially for babies and young children.

Measles symptoms typically include:

- High fever (may spike to more than 104°F)
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Rash breaks out 3-5 days after symptoms begin

Measles can be serious

- About 1 out of 5 people who get measles will be hospitalized.
- 1 out of every 1,000 people with measles will develop brain swelling due to infection (encephalitis), which may lead to brain damage.
- 1 to 3 out of 1,000 people with measles will die, even with the best care.
- You have the power to protect your child. Provide your children with safe long-lasting protection against measles by making sure they get the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine according to CDC's recommended immunization schedule.


