## Table Talk

Last Saturday, I boarded a plane for Chicago and then rented a car to drive up to Milwaukee, Wisconsin to meet our Rehoboth Band for the opening performance of our tour. It's the first time I've been on one of our music tours, and over the past four days, the kids have performed at four churches and three schools. At each location, they received rave reviews from everyone in attendance. At many of the stops, groups of students stay with host families for a night, and it's fun to hear the kids talk about their late night ping pong games and ice cream runs with these people who welcome them with wide open arms. When we perform at schools, Mr. Zwiers sets aside time for our students to mix with and introduce themselves to the students from the school we're visiting. "This is my favorite part," he says, "Because you get to see walls come down and relationships form."

Each time I step into a community outside of New Mexico that knows and supports Rehoboth, I'm blown away by the way people care for our mission and our students. Whether it's by sponsoring a student, giving to Rehoboth projects, or coming to volunteer on campus, there are so many experiences that draw people into a love for the mission of our school. It's such a reminder that we should be grateful for more than 120 years of the Lord's provision and for continued relationships He cultivates today.

At our stop in Hudsonville, Michigan, we were met by scores of folks who have worked at Rehoboth in the past: the Bremer-Bennetts, the Hollebeeks, the Huizingas, and so many more. They all wanted us to send their greetings back to our students and families as they spoke with smiles and memories of their time with us. It made us realize that the Body of Christ knows no geographical boundaries, and we were reminded just how deeply our work resonates with people—even those far, far away.

The special quality of Rehoboth is found in the hearts, minds, and talents of our students; and we have each of you to thank for that. "These kids were so kind to our children!" or "I can't believe how polite your students are!" were common responses we got in the parking lot each morning as host families brought our kids back to the bus. As I prepare to step into the Executive Director role this summer, I'm filled with tremendous pride about what Rehoboth is today and our school can become in the future. I can't wait to walk the journey of the years ahead with all of you.

### **ACE Scholarship of New Mexico - LAST CHANCE TO GET IN ON THIS - For 2024-2025 School Year**

This is a great scholarship for parents who are sending their students to a tuition- based private school like Rehoboth. They offer from \$1000 - \$4000 per student depending on grade. In order to get this scholarship for next year, you do need to apply for it by **April 15, 2024 by 11:59 pm.** Here is a chart of the income -financial guidelines to see if you qualify. Those who received this scholarship last year must reapply.

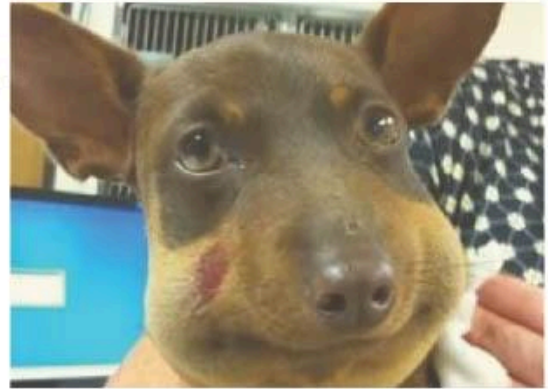

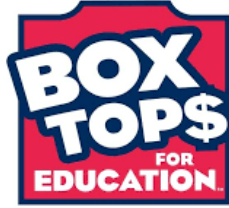
