Earlier this week, I spent three days on the high school Choir Tour with our students. They are travelling through Central California and the San Francisco Bay Area. I grew up in the Bay Area, and I have most of my family living in the central valley now, so it was a real blessing to connect with people and places that helped shape my own life.

Our students were incredible. They sounded amazing in their performances, and their host families all raved about how respectful they were and what a credit they are to their own families and to Rehoboth. That's always great to hear, because our singers go on this tour with a mindset of serving God and others using their gifts.

But they weren't the only ones putting God on display on this trip.

Our host churches and families rolled out the red carpet for us-providing incredible meals and accommodations, taking the time to learn about our students as individuals, and showing genuine curiosity and enthusiasm for Rehoboth and our mission. When I had the chance to speak at the performances, I noted how unusual it is to have people you've never met, from 800 or 900 miles away, care about you enough to put you up in their home, feed you, transport you, and love you enough to want to help with your education.

What a special gift.

Our school theme for the year has been *Unreasonable Hospitality*, and we've challenged ourselves to think about ways to bless others who come into our midst. We try to put ourselves in their shoes and imagine what might be meaningful to them or help them feel welcomed and comfortable. While I was on the tour, we got to be on the receiving end of that hospitality in Chowchilla, Escalon, Ripon, and San Jose. It was a great reminder of the power of what we are trying to do here at Rehoboth every day.

And just so you know, you'll be able to hear the choir's full program once they are back in town. The show will be Monday, April 14 at 7pm, and trust me, you won't want to miss it!

Re-Enrollment for Current Families is still available - Please get this done soon.

Please go <u>HERE</u> to the family portal to re-enroll. *District code is re-nm*. If you don't remember your password you can reset it or call 505-863-4412 and we can do that for you. Also, the tuition assistance application is part of the re-enrollment so please fill out that google form. (No paper forms this year). Thanks.

ACE Scholarship

The ACE Scholarship application is now open and available for the 2025-2026 school year to all families who fall in the financial guidelines categories seen <u>HERE</u>. This is an external scholarship that is available from a foundation that believes all children should have access to quality education. It is well worth applying for this scholarship as the recipients can receive around \$3000-\$4000 towards tuition. **Deadline is April 15.**

As Rehoboth has contracted with FACTS/ACE to pay the application fee, there are <u>two applications</u> that need to be filled out.

The first application is the Rehoboth application (for the fee waiver). The second application is the ACE scholarship. If you skip the first application the page to pay the application fee will come up on the ACE scholarship and you will not be able to submit the scholarship without paying the \$35 fee. Please fill out <u>both</u> <u>applications</u> in the order listed above. You can submit the ACE scholarship before you have your taxes done and then go back to upload your documents. Ace will email you a reminder of what documents you need to upload. If you are adding any new students this year please add their names to the ACE scholarship even though they are not admitted yet.

Seeing a tour from the other side was a great experience.

While the choir was away the high school classes changed to alternative classes. These classes explored some unique engineering, structural, culinary, mechanical, artistic, and physical challenges and ideas. I think the classes I saw and visited were awesome, and I could easily see how the work was benefiting the students and the school community and the larger community. Enrollment for new students is open. If you are a current family and plan to add a new student for the 25-26 school year you will be able to do that through your family portal in renweb. Once space becomes available we will inform you of the opening and then we can have you fill out the application.

Re enrollment:

For all current families, re-enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year began on January 17th. A parent should have received an email.

Here are some details to know:

1. One parent will receive an email that the re-enrollment packet is open in their Family Portal.

2. Only one parent is considered the "responsible parent" for re-enrollment and will get the packet for their child(ren).

3. The email will contain a link to the Family Portal.

4. The "responsible parent" needs to have a username and password set up with their Family Portal. To get yourself set up for a Parent Portal, <u>click here</u>. If you need to reset your password follow the prompts.

Who is June Camp for?

June camp is for any student between the ages of entering Kindergarten up to entering 9th grade! We have June Camp focused for students K-5 and a June Camp High Desert Horizons for 6-9 grade.

How much is June Camp?

June Camp will be \$40 a week or \$110 if you sign up for **all three** weeks at registration.

What is offered at June Camp?

June camp starts with hands-on, light academic activities in the morning. In the afternoon, students will participate in different activities both indoors and outdoors led by volunteer groups. These activities can include things like water games, crafts, and more! **There will also be an opportunity to sign up for an Explora science camp in the afternoon! Limited spots available!
