Table Talk

This is the second-to-last Parent News of the year, or if you want a fancier word, it's the *penultimate* edition. That means we're getting close to the end, and if you're like most human beings, you get a bit reflective at times like these. Your child or children are completing another year of school, and they have grown and changed. Maybe it's your son's first year, and you're excited about the skills he has acquired but wistful about how he doesn't need your help quite as much as he did before.

Maybe you have a daughter graduating, and the thought of stepping into the unknown scares you and her more than a little. Daunting questions creep into our minds at times like these:

Am I really ready for this?
Will I still have friends next year?
Am I making the right choice about my next step for college or career?

One thing we know about human beings is that uncertainty can breed fear. It's a common issue—not just in modern times, but throughout history. In fact, it's something the Lord is keenly aware of in relation to His people. We know this because the most common command in the Bible is, "do not be afraid." This command starts all the way in the Old Testament and is repeated numerous times by Christ himself in the New Testament as well.

One of the most famous passages with this command is Joshua 1:9. "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid. Do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

Be strong and courageous. The Hebrew word for that sentiment is *hazak*. If you've seen a Rehoboth boys HS basketball game, you've seen that word, written in Hebrew, on our t-shirts or warm up jerseys.

Hazak. Be Strong. Be Courageous.

The main reason God tells us to be strong and not afraid is because He is with us, but there's something else going on too. For God's people, they realized they could be strong because they had each other to lean on–people who were committed to the same faith, the same vision of life, the same goals. As you and your children transition to something new and unknown for the summer and for next year, be strong and courageous. Know that the Lord is with you . . . and so is your family. So are your friends. So are your brothers and sisters in Christ. And so is Rehoboth.

RCHS Second Semester Exam Schedule — May 2025

As a reminder and for those who are taking high school exams for the first time: Students do not need to be at school if they do not have a scheduled exam for a given time slot. However, if they are in school, they must report to their scheduled class and teacher. Students will take their exams during the scheduled time for their class period, unless authorized by their teacher. Students must report on time for their exams, and late arriving students will not be admitted to their exams.

New Students for the 25-26 school year:

Enrollment for new students is open. If you are a current family and plan to add a new student for the 25-26 school year you will be able to do that through your family portal in renweb. Our pre-k for next year is waitlist only. Please go to www.rcsnm.org then to Pre-K admissions under the admissions tab to fill out the waitlist form. Once space becomes available we will inform you of the opening and then we can have you fill out the application.

Re enrollment:

For all current families, re-enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year began on January 17th. A parent should have received an email.

Here are some details to know:

- 1. One parent will receive an email that the re-enrollment packet is open in their Family Portal.
- 2. Only one parent is considered the "responsible parent" for re-enrollment and will get the packet for their child(ren).
- 3. The email will contain a link to the Family Portal.
- 4. The "responsible parent" needs to have a username and password set up with their Family Portal. To get yourself set up for a Parent Portal, <u>click here</u>. If you need to reset your password follow the prompts.


