You have a three-day weekend coming up, because Monday is Labor Day. I always thought it was ironic that we name a day of rest "Labor Day." A quick search on the Department of Labor's website informed me that the holiday was created in the late 1800's to honor the contributions of American workers to the country's strength, prosperity, and well being.

Hard work is a good thing.

In addition to the knowledge and skills they develop during their education at Rehoboth, we want our students to take on the habit of hard work. Volumes have been written about the importance of persistence, grit, giving your best effort, and so forth. Just this year, as we started orientation with our Rehoboth staff, I shared with them the <u>"Story of the Three Sons,"</u> and how we need to take on a mindset in which it's normal to work hard and do extra.

God's people knew what hard work was during the centuries they were enslaved in Egypt. Forced to make mud bricks that built massive structures, the Hebrews toiled and labored day after day. For generations, their only sense of worth and self preservation was based on the number of bricks they could produce. Come in below your quota, and you'd feel the sting of the whip ... or worse.

After the Lord delivered them from that slavery and oppression, He set out to turn them into a new kind of people. My teacher used to say that the easy part was getting the Israelites out of Egypt. The hard part was getting Egypt out of the Israelites. God had to change their mindsets. He needed to rewire their whole approach to life. He needed to insert new rhythms into their inmost beings that would drastically alter the way they thought of themselves.

So He told them a story of how the world began.

In that story of Creation, the Lord's fingerprints are all over the universe, and we marvel at the work of His hands. But to the ear of the Israelites, something drastic would have stood out: a call for people to take a Sabbath rest. During all the mornings and evenings of the days of Creation, a landslide of "good" things populated the cosmos. But the only thing that was called <u>very</u> good was humanity. And the Sabbath day of rest didn't have a beginning or ending boundary. Because God wants us to know that we can *forever* rest in the knowledge that we carry immense value, and He'll never measure us by our work. So on this coming Labor Day, celebrate the goodness of hard work; but never forget that our relationship with the Father and the gift of His Son, Jesus, mean that we'll never have to strive to earn their love.

#### Student Drop-offs and Pick-ups

Kinder to 8th Grade families please use the Gravel Loop located behind our Mid School building to drop-off and pick-up students. Please refrain from picking up your student at the Elementary Playground/Parking Area. This area is reserved for our Pre-K families who have to park and drop-off/pick-up their students at the classroom door.

You may begin dropping off your student after 7:45 am until 8:05 am. Pick-up begins at 3:05 pm until 3:20pm. After that, please walk into the office to pick-up your student. It is helpful for the office/classroom teacher to know if you are running late. If your student is eating breakfast, you may drop them off at the Sports and Fitness Center entrance.

Lastly, please drive with caution. We want to keep our students safe. Form a single drive-up lane and pull as far ahead as

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you can to make room for other cars. When pulling out and driving away, double check to make sure there are no students around. If you need help, please talk to our traffic/pick-up monitor or call the office.




