Table Talk

I spent much of the late spring and summer dreaming about how to invite our whole staff into this year's school theme, *Unreasonable Hospitality*. We all read together David Guidara's book by the same name in which he details his relentless efforts to turn his New York restaurant, Eleven Madison Park, into the best restaurant in the world by focusing on the hospitality that diners would receive. The pages are full of delightful examples of how to bring people unexpected joy with the right mindset, some careful planning, and attention to detail.

The Bible tells stories of rich hospitality as well, and I invited us to consider the story of Abraham and the three visitors in Genesis 18. Abraham <u>runs</u> out to meet these men—something a revered family patriarch would never normally do in that time and culture. He tells Sarah to get <u>three seahs</u> (over 60 lbs!) of the finest flour to make bread, an amount that could have served 450 people well and would demonstrate bottomless abundance to the three guests. Finally, Abraham has a <u>choice calf</u> butchered for a luxurious meal of meat in a culture that would hardly ever spare one of the flock for a family dinner. Surely, these men traveling away from the safety of their own homes got a picture of the love, care, and provision of the God Abraham served.

Jesus himself references Abraham's story in Matthew 13 when He teaches, "The Kingdom of Heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into three seahs of flour until it worked all through the dough." By referencing the exact same measurement, Jesus is sending His listeners back to Genesis 18. You want to know what life with God is like? It's going to overwhelm you with love and welcome and protection and care! Hospitality is a trademark of the Kingdom of Heaven.

We know that Rehoboth is a special community with a knack for making people feel welcome. But this year, we're challenging ourselves to consider the impact we can make by taking hospitality to another level—an *unreasonable* level. Not only will it be fun to see smiles on the faces of our students, families, and guests; but it will be a chance for us to proclaim loudly through our actions, "This is the God we serve! This is what life is like in His Kingdom!" Maybe your children have already come home with special stories that bear witness to this work. I hope that's the case . . . because they are worth it.

Thank you for entrusting your children to us. I'm truly excited to walk the journey of *Unreasonable Hospitality* with you this year.

Student Drop-offs and Pick-ups

Kinder to 8th Grade families please use the Gravel Loop located behind our Mid School building to drop-off and pick-up students. Please refrain from picking up your student at the Elementary Playground/Parking Area. This area is reserved for our Pre-K families who have to park and drop-off/pick-up their students at the classroom door.

You may begin dropping off your student after 7:45 am until 8:05 am. Pick-up begins at 3:05 pm until 3:20pm. After that, please walk into the office to pick-up your student. It is helpful for the office/classroom teacher to know if you are running late. If your student is eating breakfast, you may drop them off at the Sports and Fitness Center entrance.

Lastly, please drive with caution. We want to keep our students safe. Form a single drive-up lane and pull as far ahead as you can to make room for other cars. When pulling out and driving away, double check to make sure there are no students around. If you need help, please talk to our traffic/pick-up monitor or call the office.
