Table Talk

Yesterday, I had the opportunity to enjoy our 4th and 5th graders in their Living Wax Museum. It's a common school project for students in this age group in which they research someone of historical significance and then perform an in-character presentation of that historical figure, complete with authentic clothing and a homemade museum exhibit.

As I walked through the elementary big room, I saw presentations about Maria Tallchief, the first prima ballerina in the United States and Annie Dodge Wauneka, the amazing health activist and Tribal Council member who improved the lives of so many people living on the Navajo Nation. Aretha Franklin and Rosa Parks were there, telling their stories about their passion for civil rights and equality for all Americans, regardless of their race or gender. Jackie Robinson and Kobe Bryant shared about the way they impacted hearts and minds all over the world in the midst of their athletic pursuits. And the list goes on: Bruce Lee, Neil Armstrong, Jane Goodall, John F. Kennedy, and even Elvis!

I think there's an important takeaway for our students when they participate in an activity like the Living Wax Museum. I'm reminded of the same lesson when I walk through our Code Talkers Center in the elementary-middle school library. Our kids need to see themselves in the faces and lives that changed history. Often, the impact of these towering figures started with something small—a single act or a unique piece of knowledge or skill. In the end, the legacies they left behind led to better lives and flourishing for thousands of others.

Something that starts small but makes a huge impact.

Jesus described the Kingdom of Heaven that way in some short parables during His teaching ministry. "The Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all your seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree ..." or the parable I wrote about in connection with this year's school theme, "The Kingdom of Heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into three seahs of flour until it worked all through the dough."

Yeast and mustard seeds are tiny granules that you can scarcely pick apart without a magnifying glass. Yet, their influence on their surroundings is significant. In the same way, we want our Rehoboth students to know and to practice that each time they choose to live out the way of the Lord–even if it seems insignificant–has a major impact on their own lives and their relationships with others, with creation, and with God Himself. Pretty soon, those add up, and the Kingdom of Heaven comes bursting forth in places we never would have expected. And that's glorious!

HABITUBES

This week Middle School had small group discussions on "Root and Fruit" by discussing the value of "Accurate Self-Perception." This value explores the competencies of **Self-Awareness**: The ability to accurately recognize one's emotions and thoughts and their influence on behavior. This includes accurately assessing one's strengths and limitations and possessing a well-grounded sense of confidence and optimism. It also looks at self perception: **Accurate self-perception** is not only seeing yourself for who you really are, but also embracing your unique characteristics, abilities, and shortcomings in order to build confidence in yourself and maintain an optimistic outlook on life.

Think of a beautiful tree, especially one that bears fruit like apples, oranges, or some sort of flower. When you do, it's easy to skip to the best part, the fruit. But what you probably already know is that the fruit on that tree was the last thing to grow. Trees put down roots first, then they grow a tall, sturdy trunk, and finally, when the time is right, the fruit shows up. The fruit is a result of the growth that has occurred before.

Leaders must grow the same way. They prioritize putting down stable roots (setting their values), growing a tall trunk (your strengths and talents), and then bearing fruit (results of their work and growth).

The root must come before the fruit. Let's learn more about the power of priorities.



High School Highlights

Mr. Meester has been leading the principals and a few others in a study of the book *Strong and Weak*, by Andy Crouch. In this book Crouch writes that a person who is flourishing is both strong and weak, or another way to say this is that a flourishing person has authority and vulnerability. Authority is the capacity for meaningful action, and vulnerability is exposure to meaningful risk (these are both ideas that need more than one sentence to be explained well; please ask me about this sometime). Crouch explains what happens when you have both authority and vulnerability, as well as what happens when you have one but not the other or neither of both. Having neither authority nor vulnerability is withdrawing-from society, from people, from everything. Unfortunately it is this withdrawing that I see often, but I think this withdrawing might be the easiest from which to break free. In describing breaking free from withdrawing, Crouch writes; "Choose to go places—the ocean, the mountains, or a broad, wide



field-where you will feel small rather than grand." When you feel small in the great world you will find yourself living in that moment, appreciating what is around you, and giving you a sense of your authority and what vulnerability might mean to you.

I thought of this idea as I was elk hunting this past week. The time I spent wandering through the forest gave me great perspective for the vastness of the area we live. Hunting requires patience and careful listening, and this too made me appreciate the great systems that are operating all around me, and that they are all happening without my participation or thought, and they are all amazingly awesome.

I know similar experiences are happening in many ways and places to the people in our community. I hope that our students continue to seek out experiences like this instead of virtual experiences that ask them to seek no authority or sense of vulnerability.
