Tuition Assistance applications for the 2020-2021 are available now at the end of the Parent News. After re-enrolling, please return a TA application along with your 2019 1040 tax document to our administration building. We will then complete a tuition contract for next school year.

Do we have your updated information?

Parent text alerts are sent out from time to time regarding school related changes such as school closures due to inclement weather. If you are not receiving parent text alerts there may be a few reasons why:

- 1. It may be that we have a wrong cell number on file. Please verify your cell number with us.
- 2. Your preferences in ParentsWeb may be turned "off" to receive text messages from us. These preferences were made at the time of re-enrollment or in the admission application if you applied just this year.
- 3. Check your cell services as well. Sometimes due to your service area up may not be available to receive text messages.

With #1 or #2, we can also help you take care of this. You can email or call the admissions director, however, you can also log into your ParentsWeb to update your preferences. Below are the directions:

- 1. Log into your ParentsWeb.
- 2. On the left sidebar click "Family" where you'll see a split screen and on the right is a list of your preferences. Scroll down to see "Parent Alert Cell Phone". Yes, to receive or No, to not receive.
- 3. If you want to make changes to this, on the upper right click pen icon to edit which you'll be directed to the "web forms".
- 4. Under Custodial Parents, select which parent your are changing preferences for and click "Custodial Parent Form"
- 5. Scroll down and under Parent Preferences bar, you will see the list of preferences that will say "yes" or "no"
- 6. Any changes made, don't forget to click "save" at the bottom before moving out of form. (This is also the location you make any parent updates)

Are you returning next school year?

To begin your re-enrollment click here!

63% of our students are returning and we will begin reviewing our new applications next week. Testing and interviewing new families will begin. We offer seats to our new students based off of re-enrollment. If you want to talk further about next school year, you can reach me or the school principals.

There is no re-enrollment deposit or fee. As a reminder, the following conditions need to be met to secure a seat for 2020-2021 school year:

- a) Re-enrollment must be completed through ParentsWeb
- b) No Administration concerns have been expressed regarding student academic progress or student behavior.
- c) After re-enrolling, a Tuition Assistance Application must be completed by March 27, 2020 if tuition assistance is needed. After March 27th, a full tuition contract will be made for all re-enrolled students.
- d) A tuition contract must be issued and signed.

"I've re-enrolled, now what?"

Applying for tuition assistance is the next step. The application is available now (see end of Parent News). You will also notice the tuition assistance application is different from previous years. We have added a few more questions and we may return it to ask for you to answer questions left blank.

Staying Healthy- Reminders

- 1. Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Put your used tissue in a waste basket. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve, not your hands.
- 3. Stay home if you are sick with a fever, a cough accompanied by a fever, if vomiting or if you have diarrhea. Stay home until you have been fever/symptom free for at least 24 hours without medication.


