Welcome to Table Talk:

Parenting can have its challenges during normal times. After 10 months of living during a pandemic the job of parenting has only increased. The Love and Logic institute is presenting a free parenting training online Tuesday, January 12 from 6-8pm mountain time. The training is called “Parenting in Uncertain Times” and it is certain to provide some great ideas for each of us to use as we walk this parenting journey. Please note that re-enrollment begins next week. Our prayer is that we will resume life together in August, 2021 if not before. We ask that current families reenroll in January. Please let your friends and family know that we will open new enrollment in February. Be sure to read about the Maroon and Gold Grant in the section “Board and Committee Chatter”. More information about re-enrolling can be found in the Admissions section of this issue of the Parent News.

Board & Committee Chatter:

Rehoboth has not had a tuition increase for six years. Yet, despite this reality, the school has been able expand the Elementary/Middle School counselor position to a full time position, create the sixth grade experientially based High Desert Program, create an Outdoor Leadership Class, provide a 403 B option as a staff benefit, hire an Educational Assistant to help with the larger fourth/fifth grade classes, and give several COLA adjustments for the staff. In addition we have been able to open a new high school and add a new fleet of buses- two efforts accomplished solely from fundraising and independent of tuition.

This fiscal year we are working with \$210,000 of PPP money as part of our income. We will not have that sort of extra revenue going into next year. In addition next year we are anticipating increased costs that are connected to employee benefits and increased staffing for the Student Support Services. During a first glance at the budget needs for next year, the Administration has noted a \$150,000 deficit. The need for increased revenue is clear. We continue to be blessed by consistent donations, wonderful grants, and increasing attention to alternative revenue sources. However after not having a tuition increase for six years, the Board has decided to do a small increase of 2% which would range from \$30.00 to \$160.00 per student. However, even though there is an increase- for our current parents who are re-enrolling or enrolling new students- that increase can be offset by the Maroon and Gold Grant.

Because of the Board’s past commitment to building up our Endowment, we are blessed to have scholarship money to support the Maroon and Gold Grant to help offset next school year’s proposed 2% tuition increase.

When current families re-enroll on Renweb, they will be able to check a box which asks for the Maroon and Gold Grant which will offset the 2% tuition increase for next year. This grant will be applied to the tuition contracts that are



generated for families that are re-enrolling. This option is available for ALL current Rehoboth families. Please feel free to take advantage of the Maroon and Gold Grant if this would be helpful to you and your family.

Hello all! I hope everyone is staying healthy during these difficult times. I want to make all of you aware of the most recent update I have received from the New Mexico Department of Health regarding immunization compliance. Even though we don't have in-person classes right now the **students that are enrolled here at Rehoboth must be up to date with their immunizations**. Notices have been mailed to you if your student needed any immunizations. The correct records should be submitted to the Administration Office to the Admissions Director to ensure we are in compliance with the Department of Health regulations.

This may cause some anxiety because we are all trying to stay safe and not go to the physician's office if we don't have to, but these immunizations are a very important step to keep your student healthy and safe from many other known childhood diseases. Physician offices are taking all the necessary precautions to ensure everyone's safety. Some



offices even offer to come out to your car and administer the vaccines. If you are unable to get an appointment with your child's physician, the Public Health Office offers vaccines for children. All you need is an insurance card and an appointment. The phone number for this office is 505-722-4391. In these uncertain times let's make an effort to gain some control of our students' health by getting these immunizations updated!

2021-2022 Re-enrollment available Friday, January 8th at 5pm: Re-enrollment for the next school year begins tomorrow Friday, January 8th at 5pm. A parent will receive an email that they are one designated to re-enroll their student. If neither parent receives this email, please contact the admissions office. There is no re-enrollment deposit or fee.

To re-enroll you must have a ParentsWeb account set-up. The following are directions to set-up your ParentsWeb account:

4. You will be redirected to ParentsWeb login page.

New Student Applications for the 2021-2022 school will available February 1st:

If you have additional children you'd like to enroll or have a friend interested, our online new student applications will open on February 1st. As a current parent, if you are interested in enrolling an additional child you may do so by filling out your application through your ParentsWeb account on February 1st.

Office of Dine Youth Scholarship (ODY) for Spring 2021 semester:

If you are an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation and in the 9th-12 grade with at least a 3.3 GPA, you can apply for the Office of Dine Youth Scholarship. The ODY scholarship is a semester by semester scholarship which means students will need to apply for this opportunity every semester.

The Spring 2021 scholarship deadline is Friday, January 15, 2021 at the Dept. of Dine' Education within your agency. As a courtesy, I send applications to the Dept. of Dine' Education personally and **the deadline for this option is Wednesday, January 13th by 5pm.** For those who are new students applying, applications, essay, & recommendation will need to be dropped off at the administration office or emailed to admissions@rcsnm.org. If you are a returning scholarship recipient meaning you received this scholarship this past Fall 2020 semester, you are considered a "continuing/returning student" on the application. Bus Stops and New Bus Updates:

Due to lockdowns and restrictions we will be running modified routes to bring in students who absolutely need internet access and academic support.
