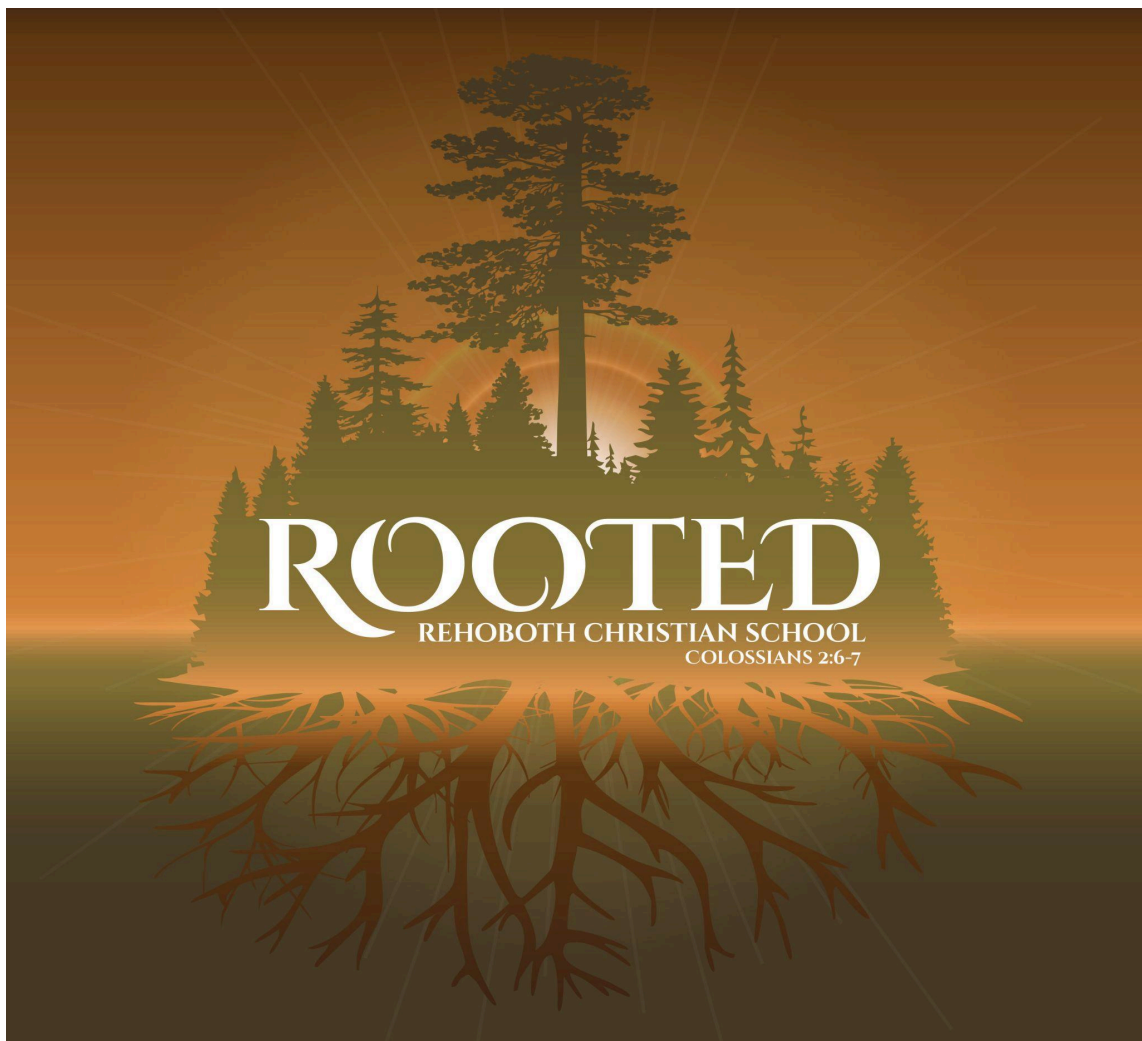


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Table Talk

Dear Rehoboth Parents and Students,

It's my pleasure to welcome you to the 2025-26 school year at Rehoboth Christian School! I can remember vividly attending a Y2K New Year's Eve party as a teacher at my first school in Chicago. What I can't believe is that the party was 25 years ago. Similarly, I remember being asked in elementary school to write paragraphs about what life would be like way off in the future—you know, like in the year 2020 or 2025! I imagined flying cars and trains that run on magnet tracks. Although we don't see those changes in a widespread sense, the world does look far different today than it did at the turn of the century.

When life throws changes or challenges at us, it can feel like we're being tossed about in a small boat during a big storm. How do we respond when faced with a sudden, dangerous illness? What do we do or say when one of our loved ones is struggling with their mental health? What happens if the future of our employment feels uncertain? How do we face difficult conversations about topics that polarize people and drive wedges between us? What comfort is there if we're questioning our faith in God or struggling with our relationship with Him?

In those kinds of times of uncertainty, it's important to have a strong foundation that supports us—something that helps us stand firm when the rest of the world feels like it's spinning out of control. The Bible compares us to trees and their roots to describe that kind of underpinning support. And that metaphor is where we get our theme for the year: *Rooted*.

Colossians 2:6-7 says, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." One of the main parts of our job here at Rehoboth is to help nurture your children's roots—to help them understand who and what deserves their trust . . . and to provide opportunities for them to practice the vulnerability of that trust, which in turn strengthens their roots even more for the future.

This year my hope is that all of us experience different ways to ground ourselves in our faith—to be *rooted*. When a tree has healthy roots, it will bear good fruit; and I long to see a campus, a community, and a world transformed by the fruit that we bear together. I'm excited to walk that journey of growth with all of you. Thanks for trusting us and partnering with us in educating your kids. Enjoy the rest of your summer, and know that we will be ready to welcome you back warmly in August.

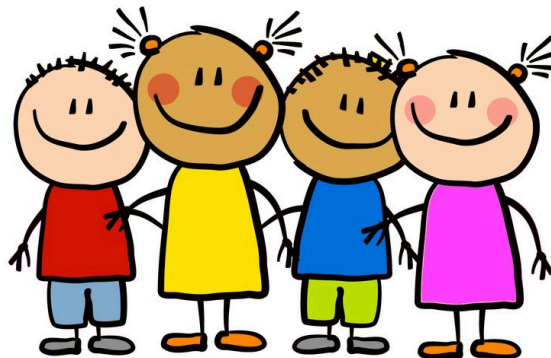

General High School Supply List

Because High School students' schedules vary for each student, this general supply list is to help you purchase some of the supplies that are typically needed in high school. Specific supplies that may be needed for a course will be distributed during the first days of school.

- ☐ It is recommended that High School students have a spiral notebook for each of their courses.
- ☐ High School students typically need a way to organize handouts and other papers for each of their courses. A three binder or a folder for each course is recommended for such organization.
- ☐ High School students should have a supply of both pens and pencils for their courses.
- ☐ Students should have a minimum of a scientific calculator for their math and science classes. For Math classes that are Algebra 2 and higher a graphing calculator is required.
- ☐ Calculator apps on smartphones, tablets, and computers do not meet the necessary requirements for courses. These apps may only be used with teacher's discretion.
- ☐ Although not required, students are allowed to bring their own devices such as personal laptops and tablets to aid in their school work. The high school does have a computer lab for student use as well as other classroom based technologies.

Parent Volunteer Program (PVP)

Rehoboth values community and to help build a stronger school community, the participation of parents and families is needed. Every year, we ask each family to give **10 hours of volunteering** throughout the school year. PVP hours are also received when parents are involved in certain Parent Community meetings.

What volunteer activities are possible?

In classrooms & in the schools:

- Assist or Tutor
- Recess/Lunch supervision
- Classroom presenter- careers, culture, hobbies, art, rodeo...
- Fundraisers for teams, choir, band, drama
- Donate baked goods for a fundraiser

Food donations count toward volunteer credit. We'll calculate your credit based on how much you spend. For every \$15 on food (from receipt) is worth 1 hour of volunteer time. For example, \$30 purchase of food = 2 volunteer hours or \$45 purchase = 3 volunteer hours.

Facility & Groundskeeping:

- Landscaping help-weeding, tree cutting, planting, watering trees

Transportation

We want to welcome you to a new school year! We are so blessed to have your children attend RCS and we want to assure that if your child rides the bus, we will do everything we can to keep them safe. Below are a few guidelines we'd like to remind you of:



1. Please make sure to **update your contact information in RENWEB..** This is also how we communicate road delays, weather cancellations, etc.
2. There will be 5 Bus Routes: **Crownpoint, Central Gallup, Tohatchi, Zuni, and Ft. Defiance.** Bus schedule and hub stops will be distributed by email and will be handed out at Parent Orientation.
3. Please be EARLY to your bus stop in the AM and PM Route. Bus drivers will be instructed to wait 2-3 minutes and move onto the next stop. **If you miss the bus during the AM/PM Route, please do not proceed to cut off or park in front of the bus to prevent it from leaving the bus stop.** You can meet the bus at the next scheduled stop.
4. If you as a parent have to make changes to your **child's bus arrangement** for the day, we ask that you PLEASE call the school secretaries HS, ES, or MS **before 2:30.**
 - High School (505)726-9632,
 - Elementary/Middle School (505)726-9675.

This ensures that we have enough time to contact the student with the proper permission slip for the bus driver. ****The bus driver will NOT allow a student to get on a different bus without that permission slip.****

5. Our policy here at Rehoboth for **dropping off kids at their respective bus stops** is to make sure each child gets off at exactly the same stop everyday; if walking home, the distances are usually less than one mile; if being picked up, our bus drivers know each vehicle and parent and/or guardian.
 - When one of these situations doesn't seem right, or we don't recognize a designated ride/guardian – **we will not allow that child to get off the bus.** Rather, we will make an attempt to reach the parent or guardian by phone and if we are unsuccessful, we will continue on our bus route and the parent/guardian can meet us at another bus stop. We will also try to drop the child off at their stop on our return to base route.
 - If we are still unsuccessful, we will call the transportation manager and make arrangements to drop off the child back at school with a school staff member until proper arrangements for pick up are made.

6. Please take some time to review with your families the following “**stranger danger**” rules:

- Walk to and from the school bus in groups if possible.
- Never talk to strangers or accept rides from them.
- Never get into a car, enter a home, look for a lost pet, or accept candy or toys from an adult, unless your parents know what you are doing and have given you their permission first.
- If anything unusual occurs, tell an adult immediately. Parents and teachers need to know right away what happened.
- Don't panic. If you are afraid or have a problem, call a parent or a trusted adult.
- Arrange for immediate access to neighbors and other trusted adults who can answer questions or be contacted in case of an emergency.
- Keep your house key hidden. Don't give it to anyone and don't keep it in a visible place that would tell people you are going home to an empty house.
- Tell a trusted adult - parent, teacher or counselor - if anyone ever makes you feel uncomfortable.

During Orientation, you will be confirming your bus hub stop location.

Hi! My name is Sarah Marlowe. I am the director and a teacher in the after school program. I have enjoyed getting to know and work with your students over the last three years, and I look forward to another year with them!

We will be offering the After School Program again this year! **We provide safe, supervised activities for PreK - 8th grade students to do after school.** We offer the services:

- **Monday - Wednesday from 3:15-5:30pm.**
- **Thursday, there will be two sessions from 1:35-3:30 pm & 3:30-5:30pm.**

One full week would include five sessions:

- Monday's, Tuesday's, Wednesday's, and two on Thursday's

Last year, we kept very close track of attendance and costs so that we would know what to charge in order to break even. The cost for each session of the after school program this year will be \$15. That comes out to just over \$7/hour. Those fees cover the wages for our workers, the snacks, and the other supplies needed to make the program a great experience for your children. Each Friday, before the week of service, the payment will be due to the administration building.

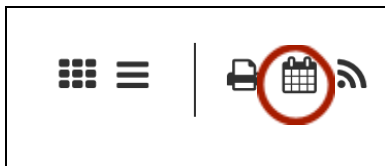

Tuition & FACTS

Tuition Contract Responsibilities

Rehoboth Christian School is sustained by committed donors and parents. Over 2,000 donors contributed 1.8 million dollars for our students in the past year. Rehoboth's existence is also dependent on parents who faithfully support Rehoboth through tuition payments. We are thankful to a loving God who uses so many for the ministry of Rehoboth.

RCS requires all families to pay their tuition bills no later than the last day of the month of the invoiced tuition bill or as scheduled through FACTS. Every month, there must be a payment made to RCS. If a payment is not made for the month, the parents must contact the Director of Finance or the Executive Director immediately. This is to ensure that families do not fall behind and allows RCS to help in a feasible manner when needed. If parents are not communicating and/or not honoring their contractual commitments, students may be asked to stay home until parents meet with the Business Office and/or Executive Director. RCS will hold your child from class once the tuition balance is more than 60 days past due.

- 1. By the end of the first quarter, invoices through September 2025 must be paid (July, August, and September) in order to continue the second quarter.***
- 2. By the end of the second quarter, invoices through December 2025 must be paid before the first day of the second semester (January 5, 2026) in order to continue the second semester,***
- 3. By the end of the third quarter, invoices through February 2026 must be paid in order to continue the fourth quarter.***
- 4. By the last day of school, all invoices must be paid (unless payment schedule through FACTS states end of month) in order to participate in final exams and school events. Transcripts and report cards will be held until tuition balance is paid.***

The intent of this policy is to ensure timely communication and/or payments. In addition to tuition assistance, other funds exist to help families meet their tuition obligations. There are both internal and external scholarships available for which families can apply. It is important that the school knows your situation. We see each other as family.

2025-2026 School Board Members
